SUMMARY AND LINK TO CORPORATE PRIORITIES

A small group of members has been meeting informally to consider how the behaviour of the public can be influenced to have a positive impact on the environment and especially the cleanliness of the borough. The group has also considered the role of a councillor in facilitating this change in behaviour.

The attached Members Clean Environment Framework Document summarises the findings of the member group with its purpose being to assist members to take the initiative to facilitate this change within their own wards and communities.

There are strong links in the attached framework document to the scrutiny review into the Community Leadership and Ward Role of Councillors - Leading from the Frontline – which was carried out in August 2010. There are also links to any future locality working with partners and any proposals emerging from the localism bill.

The proposals in this report support all of the Council's corporate priorities.

RECOMMENDATIONS

That Cabinet agree to adopt the Members Clean Environment Framework Document.

DETAILS AND REASONING

Background

The Council invests significant resources to maintain a clean environment. Whilst the public generally are respectful of their environment, there is unfortunately an element that through their behaviour are detrimental to the Council's efforts to maintain a clean borough.

The area committee action plans have identified the clean environment, especially dog fouling, as a priority. Resources to address these issues are not infinite and the member group recognise the excellent work carried out by the neighbourhood teams and the benefits of the new approach to neighbourhood working. The member group has therefore concluded that the way forward should be to change the behaviour of certain elements of the public and for members to have a key and lead role in facilitating this change.

Role of Members

The member group felt strongly about the role of members and that they should take the lead within their local areas.

The attached framework document makes provision to assist members to champion the clean environment within their communities.
