### **SUMMARY AND LINK TO CORPORATE PRIORITIES**

This report requests approval to incur capital expenditure and to accept the most economically advantageous tenders for the procurement of five vehicles.

The proposals in the report link directly to all of the Council's corporate priorities but especially Clean, Green and Safe.

### **RECOMMENDATIONS**

That Cabinet agree:

- 1. To grant authority under section 3(3) of the Financial Regulations to incur capital expenditure of £125,000 for the purchase of 3 tipper vehicles and 2 low loader vehicles.
- 2. Award of Tender: That tender B in table 1 is accepted.

That tender C in table 2 is accepted.

#### **DETAILS AND REASONING**

### **Background**

The Council's 2011/2012 capital programme includes the sum of £125,000 for the replacement of 3 tipper vehicles and 2 low loader vehicles.

Open tenders were invited in line with the Council's Contract Procedure Rules via the Chest. The Chest is the regional e-procurement portal that enables tenders and quotations to be advertised, invited, received, completed and submitted electronically.

To ensure best value bidders were requested to submit offers through The Procurement Partnership (TPP) discount structure. The TPP is a public sector procurement club which is free for members to join and generates substantial preferential support terms from vehicle manufacturers.

The invitation to tender documentation included details of the evaluation criteria which would be used to determine the most economically advantageous tender (MEAT). In both cases this was 70% cost and 30% quality, taking account of delivery, inclusive warranty and compliance with specification.

# **Details of Tenders Received and Recommendations for Acceptance**

This section reports the results of the tendering exercise and recommends those tenders to be accepted.
