
Decision making

My Neighbourhood Plan 2013 - 2015

Central Area

Background

This plan is the responsibility of Central My Neighbourhood Forum, and was set following extensive public consultation to find out what local projects people wanted.

Priorities

Ten local priorities are listed here, and only these priorities can use resources from South Ribble Borough Council. Once an item is completed or the forum chooses to change it, it can be replaced by another priority as agreed by Councillors.

This plan contains a mix of projects of differing priority, long & short term delivery, high & low cost - and will allow continuous progress & delivery. It is a living plan that will be updated as progress is made.

Resources

The council is committed to supporting the Central My Neighbourhood Plan and the forum has access to the resources outlined below.

People resources

- Councillors represent and work with their local communities
- South Ribble Borough Council officers
- Partners from local agencies

Money resources

- My Neighbourhood forum 'core fund' each forum has its own annual 'core' fund provided by the council which may be complemented by other funding and council resources. The core fund for Central is £4000 per year
- South Ribble Partnership has made £15,000 available across the borough to support delivery of My Neighbourhood Plans (£10,000 revenue, £5000 capital)
- Where the Central My Neighbourhood plan aligns directly with the Council's Corporate Plan, capital funds, such as Section 106 funding from building development may be available to help with these projects.
