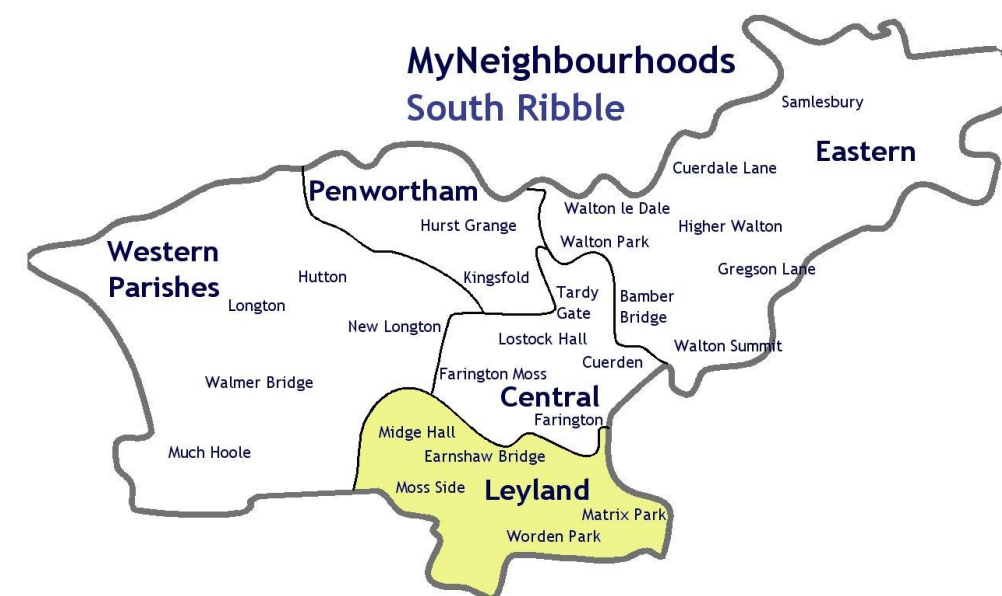
For bigger projects, where there are links to Council's Corporate Plan, capital funds, such as Section 106 funding from developments may be available.
