SUMMARY AND LINK TO CORPORATE PRIORITIES

This report requests approval to accept the most economically advantageous tender for the proposed improvement works to the overflow car park on Worden Park. Cabinet at its meeting on 2 April 2014 approved capital expenditure of £330,000 for a number of parks and open space improvements, including the Worden Park overflow car park.

The proposals in the report link directly to all of the Council's corporate priorities but especially Clean, Green and Safe.

RECOMMENDATIONS

That Cabinet agree:

1. Award of Tender: That Tender Number 6 in Table 1 is accepted for the construction of the overflow car park on Worden Park.

DETAILS AND REASONING

1 Worden Park

a) Details of Proposed Works

A consultation event has been held to assist in the development of the design proposals for improvement works to the overflow car park.

The current provision is such that the overflow car park is not suitable for use in periods of wet weather or over the winter period. The proposed area of reinforced grass will provide additional parking spaces for up to 160 vehicles during peak periods which will be able to be parked throughout the year without being reliant on dry ground conditions, there will be a requirement to close the area for a short period of time on a rotational basis following periods of heavy usage to allow recovery of the grass surface. The design conserves the open green aspect of the former agricultural fields of the Worden estate.

Subject to approval the works are expected to commence during July and be completed by September 2014.

b) Tendering Process

Phase 1 - An open tender exercise was carried out in line with the Council's Contract Procedure Rules via the Chest. The Chest is the regional e-procurement portal that enables tenders and quotations to be advertised, invited, received, completed and submitted electronically.

The invitation to tender documentation included details of the evaluation criteria to be used to determine the most economically advantageous tender (MEAT). This was 70% cost and 30% quality, taking account of methodology, work programming, to include allocation of resources at each stage and examples of previous works.

22 tender submissions were received via the Chest before the closing date. Each tender has been evaluated in accordance with the MEAT evaluation criteria. The tenders are listed in Table 1 and Tender Number 6 is the overall highest scoring compliant tender and is recommended for acceptance.
