SUMMARY AND LINK TO CORPORATE PRIORITIES

DETAILS AND REASONING

In September 2011 the Council established five My Neighbourhood Area and agreed, as part of the Constitution, the following procedure for appointing Chairs and Vice- Chairs

"4B. MY NEIGHBOURHOOD AREA PROCEDURE RULES (STANDING ORDERS)

- 1. Appointment of Chairman and Vice-chairman
- 1.1 Appointment of My Neighbourhood area chairmen and vice-chairmen shall be ratified by full Council following one nomination for each from the political group with the majority of seats from amongst the ward members representing each My Neighbourhood area for a period of one year following which it shall be reviewed."

It is now necessary to reappoint the Chairs and Vice-Chairs of the My Neighbourhood Areas until the First Business Meeting of the 2016 Municipal Year.

The nominations received from the political groups are set out above.
