# SUMMARY AND LINK TO CORPORATE PRIORITIES

A report on the approval of Testing Stations to test licensed vehicles.

### **RECOMMENDATIONS**

The Committee is requested to determine whether the Testing Stations outlined should be granted approval to test South Ribble Borough Council licensed and newly licensed vehicles.

### **DETAILS AND REASONING**

The Council currently authorises thirteen Testing Stations to test licensed vehicles and new vehicles wishing to be licensed in accordance with the Council's Roadworthiness Certificate (RWC), example attached as Appendix 1.

On 28<sup>th</sup> January 2013 all thirteen garages were written to along with garages that have previously expressed interest in becoming authorised to test licensed vehicles. Garages were given until 29<sup>th</sup> March 2013 to confirm whether they wished to become authorised Testing Stations.

Seven garages from the existing thirteen responded positively as did four garages who had previously expressed interest.

These eleven garages were then written to on 14<sup>th</sup> April 2013 and given four weeks to supply further information regarding their business practices and operation. Only eight garages of the eleven responded with the required information. This information is now presented as Appendix 2,

The eleven garages are detailed below, and the eight that provided the information highlighted in blue:
