SUMMARY AND LINK TO CORPORATE PRIORITIES

A report on a request for the Council to depart from its published age policy and license a wheelchair accessible private hire vehicle which falls outside the Council's policy on age limits.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee is requested to determine whether it wishes to depart from its policy and license a Vauxhall Movano, assuming that it meets all the Council's other criteria, which was first registered, 6 years and 4 months ago.

DETAILS AND REASONING

Mr and Mrs Wallbank hold Private Hire Operators Licence PHO098 and trade as Andrew Wallbanks Ltd. The business primarily is one of contract hire, with many of the contracts being for the transportation of disabled school children on behalf of Lancashire County Council.

Vehicle registration VX08 ADD, was first registered in the United Kingdom on 30th July 2008. Whilst the vehicle is over 6 years old, it only has approximately 20,000 mile on the clock.

In accordance with the Council's Policy on vehicle age limits (Appendix A) this vehicle would be too old to be licensed as a new Private Hire Vehicle; however, in accordance with subsection b) of this Policy, Mr Wallbank has requested Committee consider departing from this policy, given the very low recorded mileage on the vehicle.

Mr Wallbank has been asked to make the vehicle available for the Committee's inspection.

Members may wish to take into consideration the condition and safety features of the vehicle, whether any specific contracts of work would be dependent upon the use of the vehicle and whether any other exceptional factors contribute to the licensing of the vehicle.

WIDER IMPLICATIONS
