ANNEX 1- MANDATORY CONDITIONS

SALE OF ALCOHOL

1. The Premises licence holder shall ensure that no supply of alcohol is made under the premises licence- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence; or (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended (section 19 of the Licensing Act 2003).
2. The Premises licence holder shall ensure that every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorized by a person who holds a personal licence (section 19 of the Licensing Act 2003).

SECURITY PROVISION

1. The Premises licence holder shall ensure that each individual present on the premises to carry out a security activity [as defined by paragraph 2(1) (a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001] must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

ANNEX 2 - CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE

ON-LICENCES - PERMITTED HOURS

The above restrictions on permitted hours do not prohibit:

- (a) sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
- (b) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
- (c) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- (d) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;
- (e) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
- (f) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or



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- (g) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

ON-LICENSED PREMISES - CREDIT SALES

Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied unless it is paid for before or at the time when it is sold or supplied, except alcohol sold or supplied:

- (a) with and for consumption at a meal supplied at the same time, consumed with the meal and paid for together with the meal;
- (b) for consumption by a person residing in the premises or his guest and paid for together with his accommodation;
- (c) to a canteen or mess.

ON-LICENCE WITH NO CHILDREN'S CERTIFICATE

No person under fourteen shall be in the bar of the licensed premises during the permitted hours unless one of the following applies:

- (1) He is the child of the licensee (DPS).
- (2) He resides in the premises, but is not employed there.
- (3) He is in the bar solely for the purpose of passing to or from some part of the premises which is not a bar and to or from which there is no other convenient means of access or egress.
- (4) The bar is in railway refreshment rooms or other premises constructed, fitted and intended to be used bona fide for any purpose to which the holding of the licence is ancillary.

In this condition 'bar' includes any place exclusively or mainly used for the consumption of intoxicating liquor. But an area is not a bar when it is usual for it to be, and it is, set apart for the service of table meals and alcohol is only sold or supplied to persons as an ancillary to their table meals.

ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS

- 1. Adult entertainment or services, activities, other entertainment or matters ancillary to the use of the premises that may give rise to concern in respect of children is not permitted.
- 2. No irresponsible sales promotions of alcoholic beverages shall be offered to customers.
- 3. No customers carrying open or sealed bottles shall be admitted to the premises at any time the premises are open to the public.
- 4. A sign will be displayed on the premises indicating the standard hours during which the sale of alcohol is permitted.
- 5. All fire doors will be maintained effectively self closing and shall not be held open other than by approved devices.
- 6. Notices detailing the actions to be taken in the event of fire or other emergencies, including how the fire brigade shall be summoned, are to be prominently displayed.
- 7. No regulated entertainment of any type shall take place outside the premises in any areas which are within the licence-holder's control after 22.00 save for any special event seven days notice of which has been given to the licensing authority and police.
- 8. When amplified musical entertainment is taking place inside the premises after 22.00 windows and doors, save for entrance and exit purposes, will be kept shut.



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9. A sign will be located at the exit(s) requesting that customers leaving the premises do so quietly and with consideration to neighbours.
10. No one under the age of 16 will be allowed to enter or remain on the premises after 22.00 save on Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve.
11. Anyone who appears to be under the age of 18 and who is attempting to buy alcohol must be required to produce proof of age before such a sale is made.
12. The designated premises supervisor or his representative shall ensure that any noise shall be inaudible at the nearest noise sensitive location after 23.00.
13. When recorded and live music is taking place windows and doors will be kept shut.
14. The designated premises supervisor or his representative shall conduct regular assessments of the noise coming from the premises and shall take steps to reduce noise where likely to cause a disturbance to local residents.
15. A noise limiting device will be in operation whenever regulated entertainment is taking place.
16. The designated premises supervisor or his representative shall ensure that all patrons drinking outside are supervised to ensure that patrons do not cause nuisance to nearby residents and in any case shall be brought indoors by 23:00.

ANNEX 3 - CONDITIONS ATTACHED AFTER A HEARING BY THE LICENSING AUTHORITY

Licensing Sub-Committee on the 16th September 2005 held a hearing in respect of the application of Mrs Cheryl Raynor for a premises licence for the Lancashire & Yorkshire Hotel

1. The designated premises supervisor or his representative shall ensure that any noise shall be inaudible at the nearest noise sensitive location after 23.00.
.. When regulated entertainment is taking place windows and doors, save for entrance and exit purposes, will be kept shut. The internal door to have automatic door closer fitted.
3. The designated premises supervisor or his representative shall conduct regular assessments of the noise coming from the premises on every occasion the premises are used for regulated entertainment and shall take steps to reduce the level of noise where it is likely to cause a disturbance to local residents. A written record shall be made of those assessments in a log book kept for that purpose and shall include, the time and date of the checks, the person making them and the results including any remedial action.
4. Following consultation with the council's Environmental Health Department the licence holder shall ensure that a noise limiting device will be in operation whenever regulated entertainment is taking place.
5. The designated premises supervisor or his representative shall record any complaints received and actions taken in a log book.
6. The designated premises supervisor and his/her representative shall ensure that all patrons drinking in the car park and other outdoor areas are supervised by a member of staff to ensure that patrons do not cause nuisance to nearby residents and in any case shall be brought indoors by 23:00.
7. The designated premises supervisor or his representative shall ensure that the car park and all other outside areas of the premises are at all times kept in a clean and tidy condition; in particular the licence holder shall ensure that broken glass, litter and debris is cleared away promptly.
8. Refuse such as bottles shall not be disposed of from the premises outside after 20:00

In addition to the conditions listed above conditions to reflect the operating schedule and embedded restrictions will also be



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imposed. Likewise mandatory conditions will also be imposed.

Licensing Sub-Committee on the 6th December 2007 held a hearing in respect of an application from Mr Stanley Iain Duncan for a Variation to the premises licence under Section 34 LA03 for the sale of alcohol, provision of regulated entertainment and late night refreshment at Lancs & Yorks Hotel, 249 Station Road, Bamber Bridge, Preston, Lancashire, PR5 6LD

The Licensing Committee took into consideration the effect on the four licensing objectives and decided to grant the following:
TIMINGS AT STATED.

NON STANDARD TIMINGS - Granted as applied for as follows:

1. Provision of Live Music, Recorded Music, Facilities for Making Music, Facilities for Dancing, Provision of Late Night Refreshment and Supply of Alcohol: -
 - a. From 11.00 until 01.00 on Christmas Eve, Boxing Day and any Sunday or Monday forming part of a Bank/Public Holiday weekend including Easter.
 - b. From 11.00 on New Years Eve until 01.00 on 2nd January each year
2. The hours the premises are open to the public be extended for an additional hour to the standard times on the day when British Summertime begins.

The Sub Committee decided to impose additional conditions on the licence:-

1. The noise limiter be checked and set to a level agreed by Environmental Protection.
2. CCTV system be in operation in the bar area. Recordings to be kept for a period to be agreed with Lancashire Constabulary.
3. Adoption of the Think 21 Policy.
