

- (g) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

- (1) He is the child of the licensee (DPS).
- (2) He resides in the premises, but is not employed there.
- (3) He is in the bar solely for the purpose of passing to or from some part of the premises which is not a bar and to or from which there is no other convenient means of access or egress.
- (4) The bar is in railway refreshment rooms or other premises constructed, fitted and intended to be used bona fide for any purpose to which the holding of the licence is ancillary.

In this condition 'bar' includes any place exclusively or mainly used for the consumption of intoxicating liquor. But an area is not a bar when it is usual for it to be, and it is, set apart for the service of table meals and alcohol is only sold or supplied to persons as an ancillary to their table meals.

**RECORDED MUSIC**

Provision may be made for the public entertainment in the premises by the reproduction of wireless (including television) broadcasts (or of programmes included in any programme service [within the meaning of the Broadcasting Act 1990] other than a sound or television broadcasting service), or of public entertainment by way of music and singing only which is provided solely by the reproduction of recorded sound.

No one under the age 18 will be allowed to enter or remain on the premises.

Anyone who appears to be under the age of 21 and who is attempting to buy alcohol must buy alcohol must be required to produce proof of age before such a sale is made.

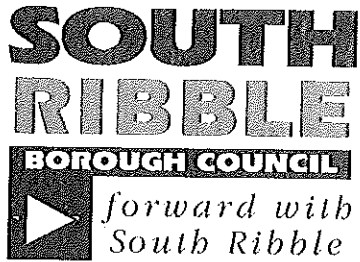

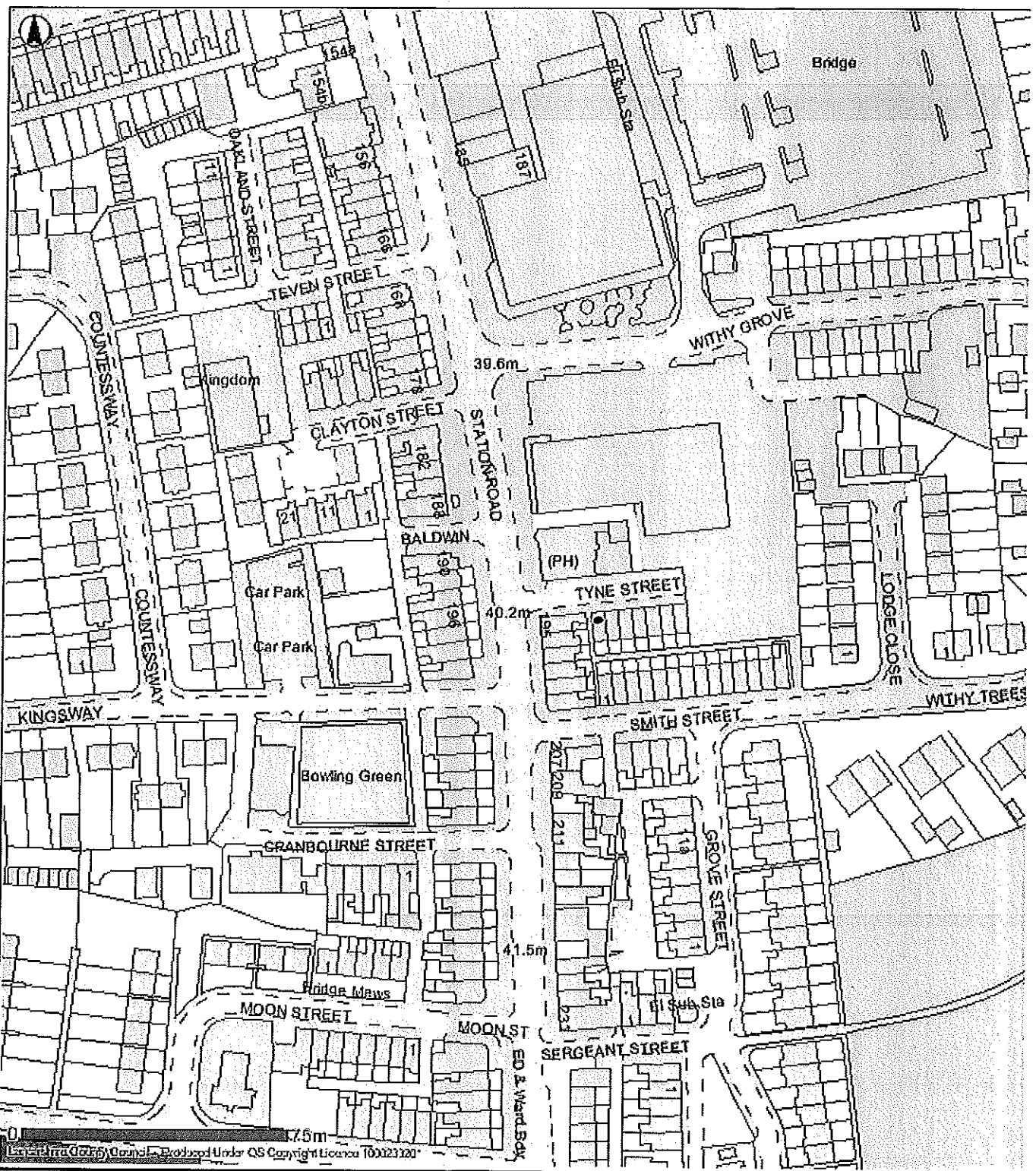

We oppose the above application by Last Orders Inn. For some time the pub has not caused much inconvenience to us with regards to sound levels. We do expect some noise from a pub, and do put up with a certain level of shouting and music from the front or rear of the property. We also have to put up with broken glass in and around Tyne Street, and inconsiderate parking from customers' vehicles.

The pub has not held live events for some time, and we have noticed a decline in the amount of fighting and nuisance generated for surrounding properties. When the pub did have live acts performing in previous years, we had to endure:

Noise and blocking of Tyne Street when unloading vehicles before events

Excessive noise during events

Noise and blocking of Tyne Street when loading vehicles after events

When vehicles were loaded or unloaded, they always used the disabled entrance onto Tyne Street. As this faces our property, it was always noisy during these times and often disturbed our children who sleep in the front bedroom of our property. We have also had occasions when performers' vehicles have been parked inconsiderately within Tyne Street, sometimes parked on the pavement outside properties, or partially blocking transit thru Tyne Street.

During events music could clearly be heard within our property on occasions. But mostly, we could hear the beat of the music which was distracting when watching television or for our children when trying to get to sleep.

We, therefore, ask that you reject the application in the interest of preventing public nuisance.

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Further to my investigations I have the following comments to make:

The Environmental Protection section of Environmental Health, in its capacity as a 'Responsible Authority' under the provision of the Licensing Act 2003, hereby give notice of our objection to the application to vary the above premises License.

The reasons for the objection are as follows:

The premise is in close proximity to residential properties. The Environmental Health team before the Licensing Act was introduced regularly received noise complaints from residents in the vicinity of the premises. Investigations showed the noise levels were a nuisance to local residents and a noise abatement notice was served under the Environmental Protection Act 1990. Noise complaints did stop when the premises stopped playing recorded music and providing live entertainment.

The hours of music applied for are unacceptable and without the recommendations highlighted below is likely to lead to noise nuisance.

Consequently, I recommend that the application should be amended:

1. Live music, films, recorded music and performances of dance to finish at 23.00 including anything entertainment falling into box H.
2. No music to be played outdoors at any time.

The following items should be included in the Operating Schedule:

3. A noise limiting device shall be fitted and maintained on the premises to control all sources of amplified music at the premises.
4. All windows facing the residential houses on Tyne Street to be double glazed.

5. Sound attenuation measures to control internally generated noise shall be installed into the premises and agreed in writing by Environmental Health.

*Sound proofing at side walls required*

6. A noise assessment of the premises shall be carried out by a suitably qualified person (Institute of Acoustics). The assessment shall be submitted to and agreed in writing by Environmental Health. The agreed measures shall be thereafter, retained and maintained for the duration of the approved use.

7. The DPS or his representative shall ensure that noise generated by regulated entertainment shall be inaudible at the nearest noise sensitive Location after 11pm.

8. The DPS or his representative shall conduct regular assessments of the noise coming from the premises on every occasion the premises are used for regulated entertainment and shall take steps to reduce the level of noise where it is likely to cause a disturbance to local residents. A written record shall be made of those assessments in a log book kept for that purpose and shall include, the time and date of the checks, the person making them and the results including any remedial action.

9. When regulated entertainment is taking place windows and doors, save for entrance and exit purposes, will be kept shut. The internal door to have automatic door closer fitted.

10. The DPS or his representative shall record any complaints received and actions taken in a log book. Setting of the noise limiting device shall also to be entered into the log book.

11. For all times after 23:00 the designated premises supervisor or his representative shall arrange that a suitable member of staff is responsible for ensuring that people leaving the premises do so as quietly as possible.
