Dear Sir,

I understand that Mrs Linda Cartwright of 19 Back Lane, Longton, has applied for a Premises Licence in respect of 139 Liverpool Road, Longton, PR4 5AB, the said Licence for Recorded Music, provision for making music and supply of alcohol between the hours of 0800 and 2300 with permission to remain open till 2330 ↵

I live at 139A Liverpool Road, Longton, which is the flat above the said premises. I own the flat, I am retired, and have lived in it for 25 years. Knowing the building (and premises) as I do, I can say that I don't think it is suitable for such a venture without consideration being

given to extensive soundproofing.

Since the change of use of said 'Premises' in March, 2011, from Flower Shop (25 years) to Coffee Shop, the opening hours have increased from 50 hours to 70 hours per week, increasing the problem time, parking, etc.. The new proposed hours of opening would amount to 108½ hours per week, which is more than double the original 50 hours, lengthening even further the hours of noise and disturbance, hence the necessity for consideration to be given to soundproofing and the welfare of the people who actually reside on the building.

Negotiations have taken place between the Local Authority, the Police and the applicant and the applicant agrees to the following conditions being applied to her licence.

1. Within 14 days of the licence being granted a tamper proof, digital CCTV system will be installed in liaison with and to the satisfaction of Lancashire Constabulary. The system shall cover all of the public areas within the premises
2. The system shall record at all times the premises are open to the public and every recording shall display the correct date and time.
3. There will be, at all times the premises is open, someone at the premises who can operate and download images from the system and provide a copy of these images to any responsible authority at the time of request.
4. The premises will operate a challenge 21 policy as a minimum and signs promoting the policy will be prominently displayed at the public entrance and all alcohol sales areas.
5. The Designated Premises Supervisor will ensure the premises will maintain an incident/refusals book and will retain a record of all incidents relating to the premises, its staff and customers, including time, date, nature of incident and outcome to the satisfaction of Lancashire Constabulary and the Local Authority. This record will be available on request to any responsible authority.
6. Notices shall be prominently displayed at the exits advising customers to leave quietly and with consideration for residents.
7. The premises licence holder shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that all customers leaving the premises, do so quietly and do not cause a nuisance to local residents.
8. The DPS shall ensure that the area around all entrances/exits or where customers congregate to smoke will be kept clean, tidy and free from litter, including smoking related litter.

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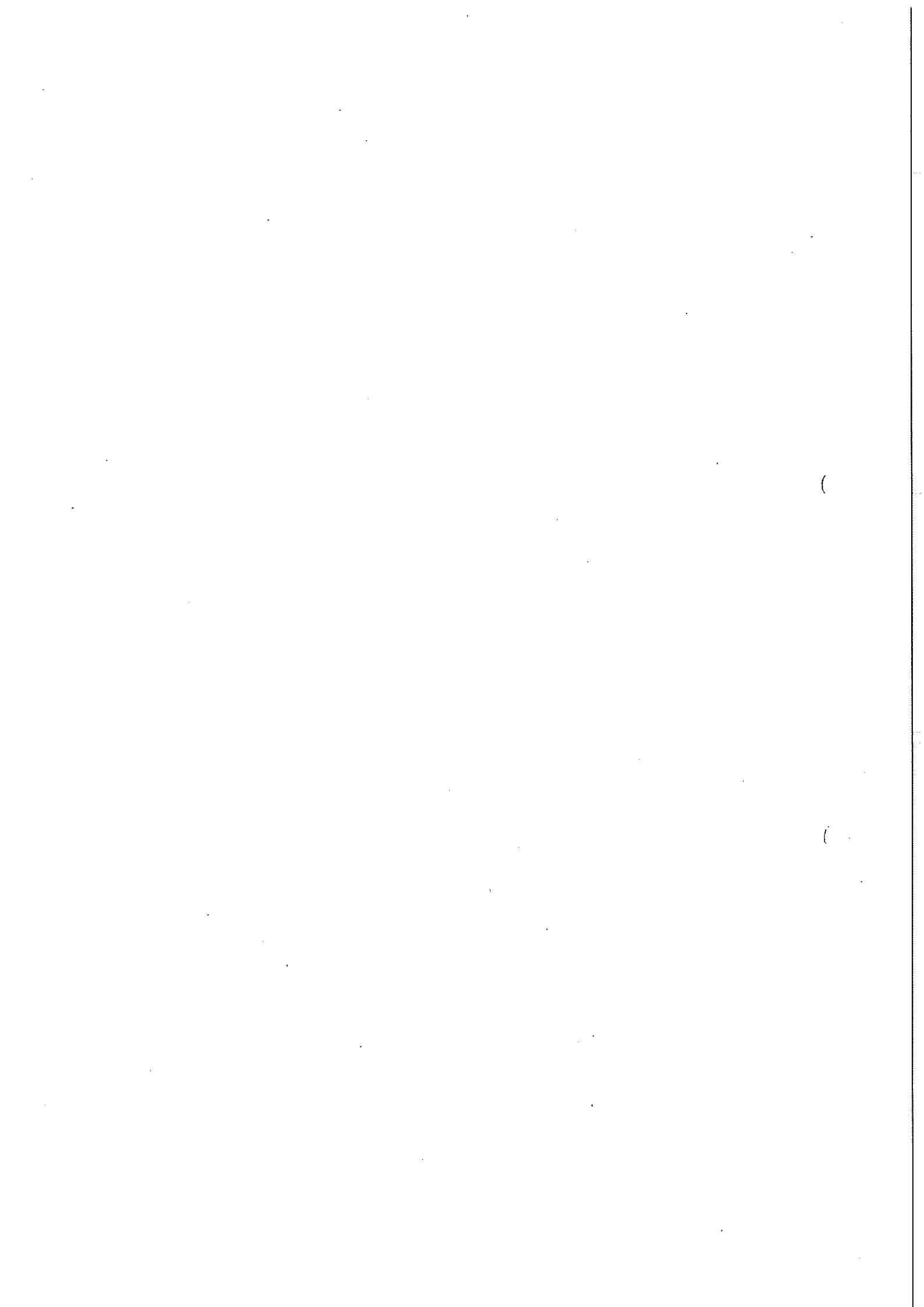

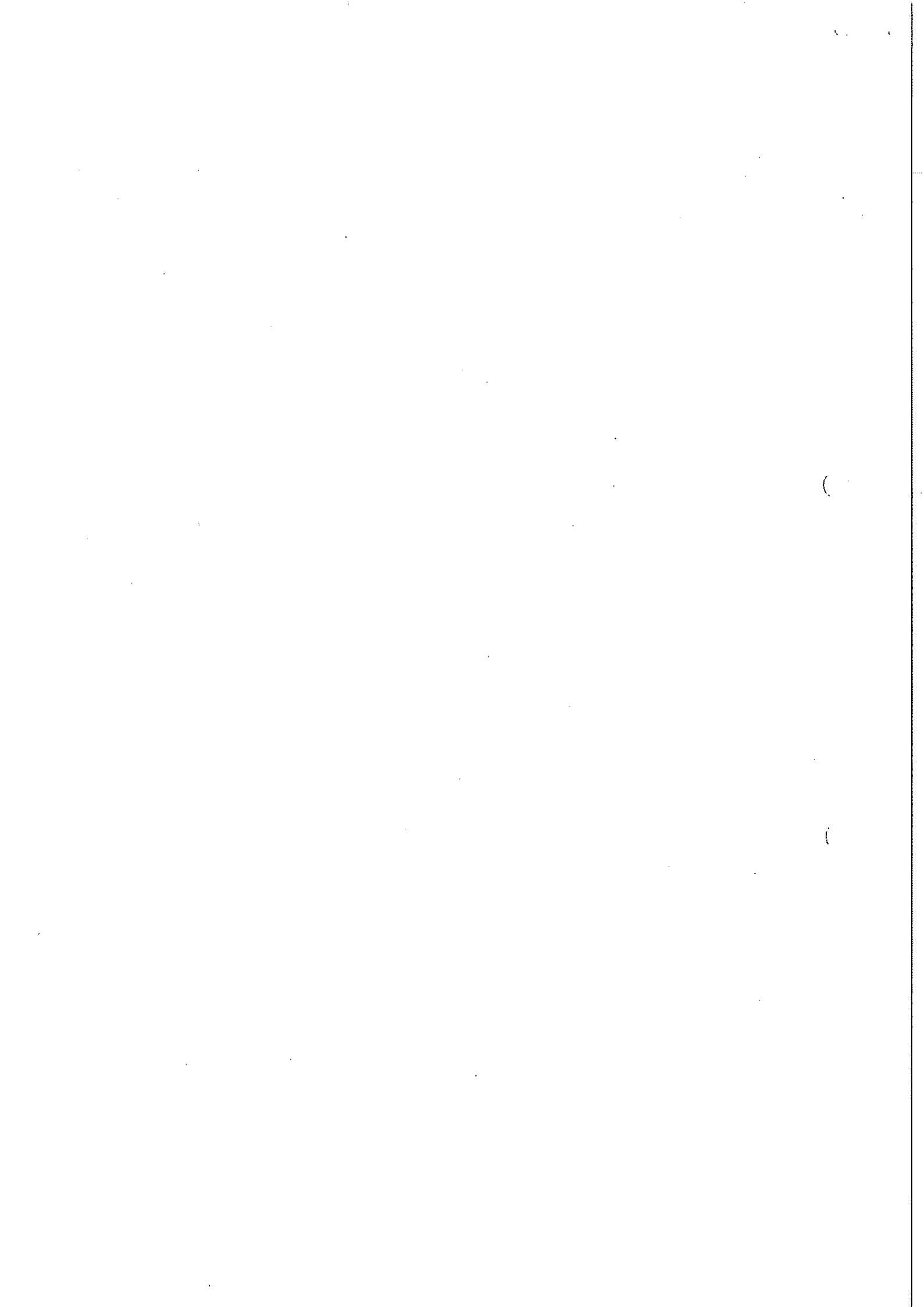

Hi Linda

I've spoken to the Police Licensing Unit and they are happy to give you 14 days from the grant of the licence to have the CCTV system installed and not to specifically require external coverage so I have amended that condition to reflect that.

After our discussion about the type of musical entertainment you were planning, I can confirm that playing CD's to create some background music, falls outside the definition of regulated entertainment and so does not require authorisation as part of your premises licence.

If you wish to leave the provision of recorded music and facilities for making music on the application, environmental health would also seek the following 2 conditions to be added to the attached document.

17/06/2011

1. All doors shall have self-closing devices fitted that are maintained in working order at all times.
2. All doors and windows must remain closed whenever regulated entertainment is being provided, except to allow access to and egress from the premises.

Please can you confirm if you are happy to amend your application to reflect the conditions requested, and clarify if you still require regulated entertainment.
