The Prevention of Harm to Children	Yes	Next door to Singh stores, is a unit called The Base the operation of which is supported by NPHS to offer children on the Broadfield estate diversionary activities. These diversionary activities go some way to occupying those children who are vulnerable through a lack of parenting skills or those who are not vulnerable but want to take up the chance of enhancing their leisure time. The violent incident which has given rise to this review is of concern as it occurred when The Base was open and children were in attendance. These children should not have been subjected to this sighting of violence when it was thought that they were in a local shop which caters for children. On Thursday 11 October 2012 The Base would have been operating training and community usage.
To prevent Public Nuisance	Yes	A responsible licence holder would not have allowed a member of his staff to engage in violence in a public place; he would not have enabled this violent fight to take place by taking over the serving of customers in the shop. Rather than make a stand to prevent public nuisance the license holder supported his member of staff in engaging in this public nuisance.
To prevent Crime and Disorder	Yes	Since a serious alcohol fuelled disorder during 2006 NPHA have worked hard to prevent crime and disorder on the Broadfield estate by both supporting our tenants to change their poor behaviour and by enforcing the tenancy conditions of those people who will not change. Immediately after the incident of 11 <sup>th</sup> October the premises went on to serve the customer involved with even more alcohol; despite telling the responding police officers that this customer was drunk.
Public Safety	Yes	The servicing of a drunken customer who had engaged in violence demonstrates an irresponsible attitude to alcohol sales. Given the density of known alcohol dependant individuals on the Broadfield estate, NPHA needs the management of Singh Stores to be responsible retailers who support NPHA in their endeavors to tackle alcohol fuelled anti social behaviour on the estate. The incident under consideration today clearly demonstrates that they are not.
