



Procedure for all hearings before Licensing Panel to determine applications made under the Licensing Act 2003

Preliminary Points

It has been agreed by Licensing Committee that, in addition to the Declaration of any personal or prejudicial interest (in accordance with the Local Government Act 2000):-

- Any member in whose ward an application premises is situated will declare this and will not take any further part in the hearing of the application
- Any member of a Licensing Panel who wishes to either support or oppose the granting of a licence either personally or on behalf of their constituents, must attend either as a supporter of the application or as an objector and sit in the public gallery. The panel on which that member serves may not hear the application
- Subject to section 100A of the Local Government Act 1972, the panel may exclude the public from all or part of a hearing where it considers that the public interest in doing so outweighs the public interest in the hearing, or that part of the hearing, taking place in public. This will include, at the discretion of the panel the exclusion of the public during its deliberations and its decision making.

Hearing Process

- 1) General Introduction by Chairman.
- 2) In accordance with the Regulation 23 of The Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005 the Chairman of the panel will lead the discussion.
- 3) A Licensing Officer will briefly outline the application for the licence and the procedure to be followed in the hearing.

4) Applicant(s) Case

The objector(s) and/or their representatives and the panel may ask questions of the applicant and/or their representatives.

5) Objector(s) Case(s)

The applicant and/or their representatives and the panel may ask questions of the objector(s) and/or their representatives.

- 6) The Chairman will then ask the applicant if, in light of the representations, they wish to amend the application. The panel will only consider the application laid before it during the decision making.

- 7) Summing up;
- i) Objector(s) Case(s)
 - ii) Applicant(s) Case

8) Conclusion

The Chairman will ask the Licensing Authority Legal Representative whether there are any other matters to be raised or resolved before the hearing is closed for deliberations.

9) Deliberations

Generally speaking the public and the applicant will be excluded when the panel is determining the hearing decision. Once a decision has been reached all parties will be readmitted to the hearing. At this stage the chairman will announce the panel's decision and will give reasons for the decision.

10) Notice of Decision

All parties will be notified of the decision at the earliest possible opportunity.

It has been suspected that the Premises Licence Holder of these premises has been receiving stolen property from local youths, selling cannabis and selling alcohol to underage persons. The Premises Licence Holder has been obstructive and aggressive to police officers when they have been conducting enquiries into stolen property at the premises. The premises has been subject of a drugs warrant where upon being searched the Premises Licence Holder was found in possession of cannabis bush. It is also evident that the Premises Licence Holder is not complying with conditions attached to his licence.

In view of the above it is felt that the Premises Licence Holder is undermining the Licensing Objectives of Crime and Disorder and the Protection of Children from Harm.

These proceedings arise as a result of information gained by police officers whilst investigating the theft of a mobile phone belonging to a teacher from Lostock Hall High School in May.

The information related to the premises and suggested that the owners were accepting stolen property in the form of mobile phones and other electronic devices, this seems to have been corroborated somewhat as a previously stolen phone was recovered, by its owner, from the shop after it had been sold to them. In addition to this further information came to light that suggested the operators of the premises were selling cannabis from the premises and this was common knowledge amongst youths in the area. It was also suspected that the premises was selling alcohol to underage youths in the area.

In relation to the investigation into the theft of the mobile phone PC Salkeld and PC Jackson attended the premises on the afternoon of Tuesday 21st May 2013 to conduct enquiries into whether the phone had been sold to the shop. The officers spoke to the Premises Licence Holder Sadir HUSSAIN and will say that he was very obstructive and un-cooperative with the officers particularly in relation to accessing CCTV footage at the premises. As a result the officers were unable to finalise their enquiries. (Statements attached)

In relation to the information that drugs were being supplied from the premises a search warrant under the misuse of Drugs Act was executed at the premises on Wednesday 12th June by neighbourhood officers in company with the police and local authority licensing officers.

At this time HUSSAIN was present on the premises and was after being informed of the reason for the search he was asked if there were any drugs on the premises or on himself at the time, he stated there was not. However upon being searched a quantity of cannabis bush was found in his possession, when it was pointed out that he had lied when specifically asked if he had any drugs he replied by saying "It's your job to find it".

HUSSAIN was asked how he had got to the shop that morning, as he lived out of the area, he stated his brother had dropped him off. However further enquiries revealed a Silver BMW parked outside the premises which upon checking was registered to HUSSAIN. Keys for the vehicle were recovered from inside the shop and upon searching the vehicle a further quantity of cannabis bush was recovered. It was again pointed out to HUSSAIN had again lied and again he stated "That's your job".

Hussain was subsequently dealt with for possession of cannabis and received a police caution for the offence.

The area around Linden Drive and in particular the local school has experienced a number of incidents of criminal damage, which has resulted in the school having to invest in bigger fences and increased CCTV coverage. It is believed that these incidents are committed by youths under the influence of alcohol and it is suspected that they are sourcing the alcohol from these premises.

PCSO Iddon can say she has witnessed activity around the premises that would lead her to believe this is the case and it is evident that HUSSAIN is allowing youths to congregate outside his premises. (Statement attached)

The police have real concerns over HUSSAIN being the premises licence holder of these premises, due to his criminal activity and clear failure to work with or co-operate with the police. Upon examining the premises licence it is clear that the

condillons attached to the licence under Annex 2 are not fit for purpose and It is clear that he is falling to comply with some of them.(Copy of licence attached)

In essence the police have no faith in HUSSAIN and feel, due to his evidenced behaviour, is not someone who can be trusted to promote the licensing objectives, the licence is not fit for purpose and therefore the police would respectfully request the revocation of the premises licence.

I make this statement in relation to a male who I now know to be Sadir HUSSAIN 30/06/1981.

On Tuesday 21st May 2013, at approximately 13:00 hours, I attended Lostock Hall High School in relation to a report of a theft of a mobile phone from a member of staff. Whilst at the school I received information that stolen goods were being sold to Smiths Stores, Linden Drive, Lostock Hall.

At approximately 13:30 hours, I attended Smiths Stores in company with PC 4000 Nicola JACKSON and spoke with Sadir HUSSAIN. We explained that we had received a report that a mobile phone had been stolen and that the offender may have been in the shop trying to sell it. HUSSAIN initially denied access to the CCTV and informed me that if we did not have a warrant then we could not view it. HUSSAIN was irate, obstructive and despite our efforts to calm him and explain was uncooperative. HUSSAIN stated that we had accused him of being a thief. Both PC JACKSON and I explained numerous times that we had not said or insinuated this and explained that viewing the CCTV would prove that the information that we had been given was false if the offender has not been to the store. HUSSAIN stated that his word should be good enough and if it wasn't then we were accusing him. I explained that unfortunately due to the way society is we can not just take people at their word and work on evidence based facts. Eventually HUSSAIN allowed us to view footage from the day before but stated that the

day of the offence had been overwritten. HUSSAIN insisted that we stay on the shop floor and view the footage on the television near to the till. HUSSAIN was insistent that we were not allowed to go into the store room where the CCTV equipment was kept. HUSSAIN played the footage from the previous day but continued to be obstructive and played the footage on fast forward so that we were unable to view it properly stating that if he were to play it in real time we would be there all day.

PC JACKSON asked HUSSAIN if he had any identification. HUSSAIN initially refused stating that we did not need to know who he was. However he eventually produced a bill with his name on and a bank card.

HUSSAIN did state that he had purchased a stolen mobile telephone in the past but had returned this to the owner upon discovering that it was stolen. MR HUSSAIN was completely uncooperative, intimidating and made it quite clear that he did not want police in his shop.

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

This is my statement regarding a male that I now know to be called Sadir HUSSAIN.
30/06/1981.

On Tuesday 21st May 2013, at approximately 1300 hours, I attended LOSTOCK SECONDARY SCHOOL, and took a report of a theft of a mobile phone from a member of staff. Following the incident I received some intelligence that the phone had been sold to the owner of SMITHS 43 LINDEN DRIVE, LOSTOCK HALL, PRESTON.


At approximately 13:30 hours, I attended the above address with my colleague PC 3190 SALKELD, and spoke with Sadir HUSSAIN. I requested to view his CCTV, from 2 days previous. HUSSAIN was reluctant to show us the footage and claimed that his system overwrites after 24 hours. I explained the reason behind viewing the footage, however he continued to be obstructive and skipped through the footage quickly so I was unable to see clearly what had happened.

I asked HUSSAIN for identification, he refused to show me photographic identification, and said he could only show me a bill with his name on and a bank card.

HUSSAIN became irate with PC SALKELD and I, stating that we had accused him of stealing the phone. We explained that this was not the case. I felt this behaviour was a diversion tactic, to try and intimidate us and prevent us from watching the CCTV.

HUSSAIN told PC SALKELD and I, that he had bought a stolen mobile phone from a school child in the past, but decided to return it to the owner after he discovered it was stolen.

I am Police Community Support Officer 7469 NATALIE IDDON of Lancashire Constabulary currently stationed at Lostock Hall Neighbourhood policing office, 1 Hutton Hall avenue, Lancashire Police Headquarters, Hutton.

I make this statement in relation to Smiths Store, Linden Drive, Lostock Hall. I have been working around Lostock Hall for the passed 14 months and have observed the premises on a regular basis. There have been numerous complaints over the years from residents on Linden Drive regarding the number of youths congregating around the shop causing a nuisance. I regularly see the same group of youths outside the store and also smoking with Sadir HUSSAIN 30/06/1981 who is the owner of the shop. I believe that HUSSAIN is selling the alcohol and tobacco to these and other underage youths in the area. Lostock Hall Academy have also been experiencing criminal damage to the school which has been alcohol related this includes a number of windows being smashed which have caused the school to take necessary action in preventing further damage and putting large fences and numerous CCTV cameras up. The care taker of the school has been in regular contact with myself as he has had to clean up smashed bottles and empty bottles of alcohol on the school premises after the evenings and weekends and been confronted by a number of underage youths under the influence of alcohol. The area around Linden Drive shops have been a high priority for the Neighbourhood Policing team for over 2 years due to the underage drinking and anti social behaviour.

An example of where I believe the premise is selling to underage is on Saturday 2nd February 2013 at approximately 20:00 hrs I was on full uniformed patrol in an unmarked police vehicle on LINDEN DRIVE outside the Smiths Store. I was stationary on LINDEN DRIVE and a group of youths walked from the shop with blue carrier bags full of what looked like glass bottles. The youths headed towards Lostock Hall community primary school on LINDEN DRIVE. The youths then continued onto the footpath which takes them down to the fields at the back of Lostock Hall Academy. I parked my vehicle outside the primary school and went on foot down the footpath to talk to these youths. The youths spotted me and made off on foot with the carrier bags towards the front of the school and onto TODD LANE NORTH. I recognised a couple of youths in the group that I believed were under 18 and definitely recognised one of the youths from the local area who I know to be 15 years old.

About 2100 hrs the same evening I again saw the group of youths walking up WATERINGPOOL LANE in the direction of LINDEN DRIVE and were next to the Gas tower. I noticed that this group had bottles of alcohol with them and as I knew they were not 18 I approached them to speak to them. Upon seeing me approaching them the group made off leaving the bottles of alcohol on the pavement which I seized.

Upon checking the alcohol I found there was 2x 1 Litre bottles of Amirino, I made enquires with all the outlets in Lostock hall and identified that only one outlet sold Amirino which is SMITHS STORE on linden drive. There where also 5x 275ml of Carlsberg, 3x Cans of Fosters and 2x Cans of Budweiser which where inside 2 blue plastic shopping bags.

On remembering the youths had come from SMITHS STORE in possession of some blue plastic bags I made back to the store to talk to the shop owner. I then noticed HUSSAIN smoking with another one of these youths and acting very friendly and on first name terms. I then asked HUSSAIN whether he sold the alcohol I was in possession of which he replied that he did. I then stated that I had seized the alcohol from a group of youths seen leaving the area of his shop earlier on in the evening to which he seemed on edge and panicky about. I then asked what shopping bags he has in his shop which he stated were blue plastic bags and HUSSAIN confirmed the bags I was in possession of were from his shop. I asked HUSSAIN whether he had sold this alcohol today which he stated he couldn't remember.

SECURITY PROVISION

1. The Premises licence holder shall ensure that each individual present on the premises to carry out a security activity [as defined by paragraph 2(1) (a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001] must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

SALE OF ALCOHOL

1. The Premises licence holder shall ensure that no supply of alcohol is made under the premises licence- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence; or (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended (section 19 of the Licensing Act 2003).
2. The Premises licence holder shall ensure that every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorized by a person who holds a personal licence (section 19 of the Licensing Act 2003).

Review of Premise Licence – Kwik Stop News and Booze
43-45 Linden Drive, Lostock Hall, Preston

With reference to the above review, I am able to confirm that as a result of information received regarding alleged sales of single cigarettes to children, Lancashire Trading Standards carried out a test-purchase exercise at Kwik Stop News and Booze on 9th February 2013.

As a result of this, a 15 year old girl was sold a packet of 10 Lambert and Butler cigarettes by a **Mr Adil Hussain**. The girl was not asked to produce any form of ID or asked her age at the time of sale.

Mr Adil Hussain is believed to be the brother of the owner of the business, **Mr Sadhir Hussain**.

Several attempts were made to speak formally with Adil Hussain following the sale, but no response was received to any correspondence sent to the address he gave as his residence.

Mr Sadhir Hussain was formally interviewed about this matter and, as a result, was required to attend an Age Restricted Products Awareness course.

Lancashire Trading Standards view the sale of tobacco to underage children as a serious matter. Our test-purchase operations are designed to check whether or not traders are acting in a responsible manner in relation to the supply of tobacco products. The operations use volunteers who are obviously underage and, as such, we would expect that any responsible retailer would challenge the volunteer for ID at the point of sale.

The above circumstances indicate a failure of the business to implement a robust system to prevent the sale of age-restricted products to underage purchasers. This would include sales of not only tobacco, but other age-restricted products such as alcohol. Consequently, we would support this Licence review.

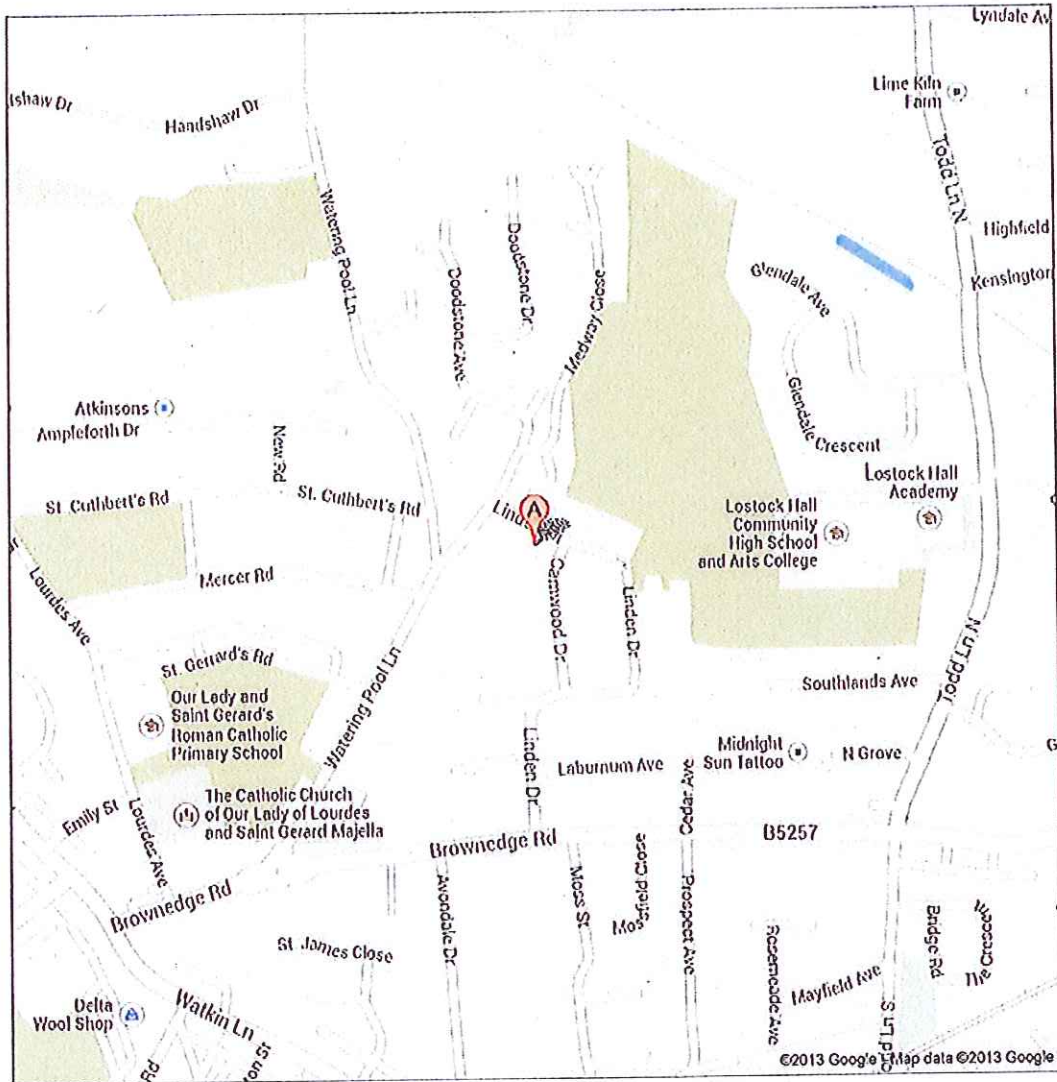

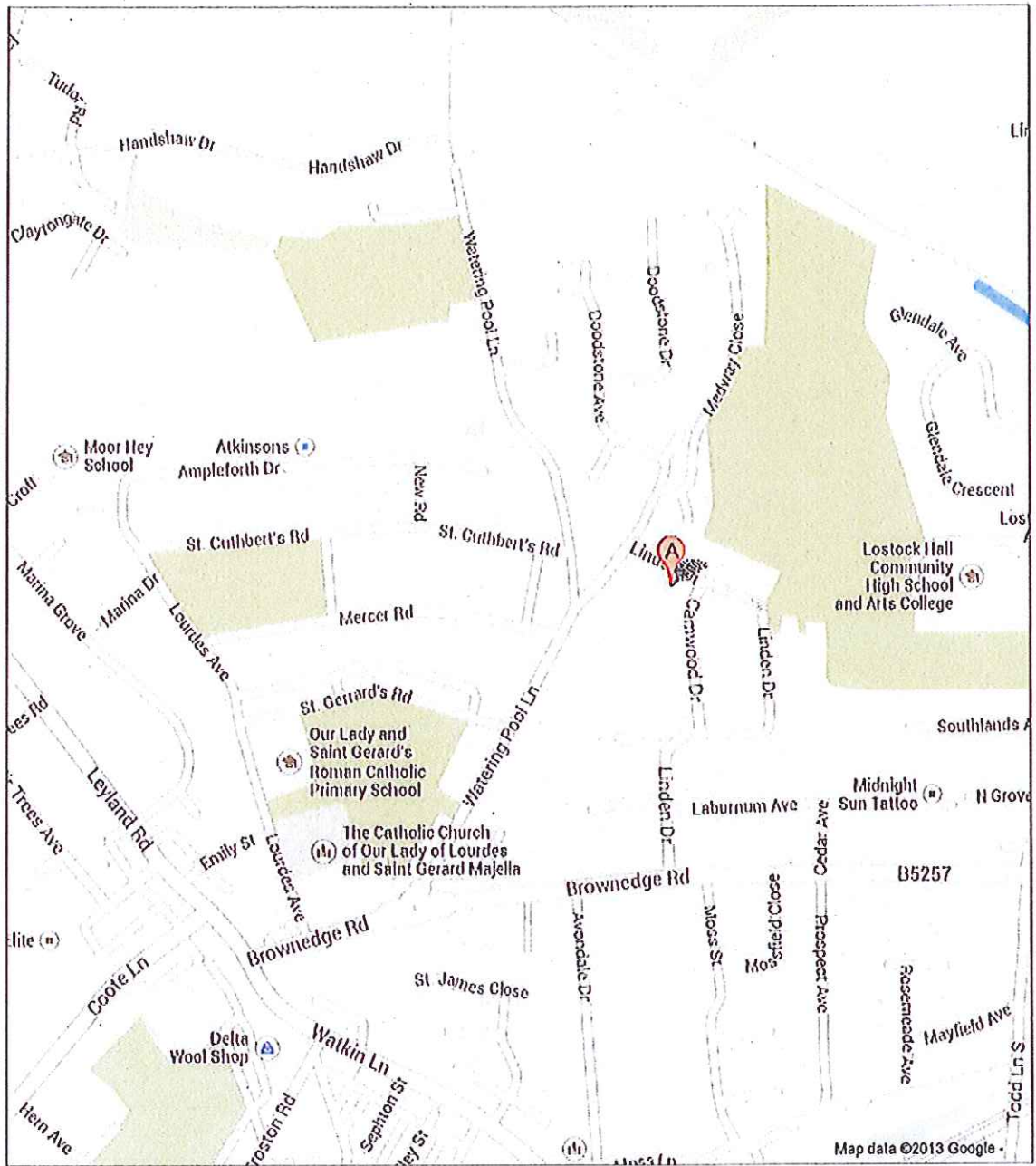
