



Procedure for all hearings before Licensing Panel to determine applications made under the Licensing Act 2003

Preliminary Points

It has been agreed by Licensing Committee that, in addition to the Declaration of any personal or prejudicial interest (in accordance with the Local Government Act 2000):-

- Any member in whose ward an application premises is situated will declare this and will not take any further part in the hearing of the application
- Any member of a Licensing Panel who wishes to either support or oppose the granting of a licence either personally or on behalf of their constituents, must attend either as a supporter of the application or as an objector and sit in the public gallery. The panel on which that member serves may not hear the application
- Subject to section 100A of the Local Government Act 1972, the panel may exclude the public from all or part of a hearing where it considers that the public interest in doing so outweighs the public interest in the hearing, or that part of the hearing, taking place in public. This will include, at the discretion of the panel the exclusion of the public during its deliberations and its decision making.

Hearing Process

- 1) General Introduction by Chairman.
- 2) In accordance with the Regulation 23 of The Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005 the Chairman of the panel will lead the discussion.
- 3) A Licensing Officer will briefly outline the application for the licence and the procedure to be followed in the hearing.
- 4) Applicant(s) Case

The objector(s) and/or their representatives and the panel may ask questions of the applicant and/or their representatives.

- 5) Objector(s) Case(s)

The applicant and/or their representatives and the panel may ask questions of the objector(s) and/or their representatives.

- 6) The Chairman will then ask the applicant if, in light of the representations, they wish to amend the application. The panel will only consider the application laid before it during the decision making.

- 7) Summing up;
 - i) Objector(s) Case(s)
 - ii) Applicant(s) Case

- 8) Conclusion

The Chairman will ask the Licensing Authority Legal Representative whether there are any other matters to be raised or resolved before the hearing is closed for deliberations.

- 9) Deliberations

Generally speaking the public and the applicant will be excluded when the panel is determining the hearing decision. Once a decision has been reached all parties will be readmitted to the hearing. At this stage the chairman will announce the panel's decision and will give reasons for the decision.

- 10) Notice of Decision

All parties will be notified of the decision at the earliest possible opportunity.

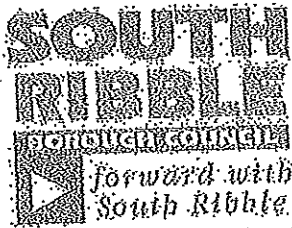

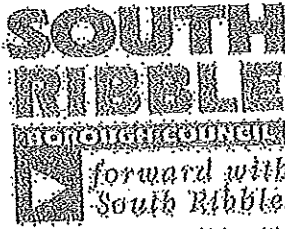

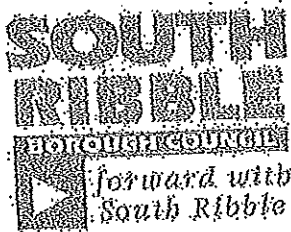

there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence) or (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended (section 19 of the Licensing Act 2003).

2. The premises licence holder shall ensure that every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence (section 19 of the Licensing Act 2003).

3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise)

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

(e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability)

4. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers.

5. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either - (a) a holographic mark, or

(b) an ultraviolet feature

6. The responsible person shall ensure that -

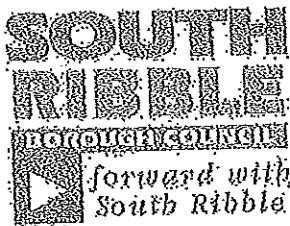
(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -

The following 3 conditions were applied to the licence along with a reduction in the hours for licensable activities on a Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday nights.

1. The Premises licence holder or their representative shall employ a minimum of 4 door supervisors at the premises on a Friday and Saturday night from 22:00 until the premises are closed and customers have dispersed from the area.
2. There shall be no entry to the premises to customers after midnight on a Friday and Saturday.
3. Customers shall be prevented from smoking or drinking at the front of the premises at any time. Smoking should only take place in the designated area within the beer garden.

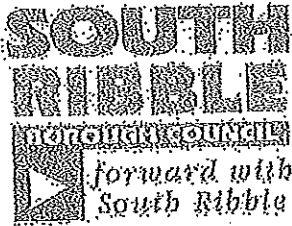
Licensing Sub-Committee on the 26th May 2009 held a hearing in respect of an application from Lancashire Constabulary for a Review of the premises licence at George IV Hotel, 63 Towngate, Leyland, Lancashire PR25 2LR.

The Sub Committee decided to impose additional conditions on the licence:-

7. The DPS will have a written policy in relation to drunkenness and all staff will be subjected to ongoing regular training in respect of its contents. This training will be recorded and copies of these records will be made available on request to any responsible authority.

We are in receipt of an application under Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003 to vary the premises licence at Barristers, 63-65 Towngate, Leyland.

The application seeks to vary the hours of licensable activity on certain days at the premises and also details operating hours which mirror hours already authorised on the licence.

The police would have no representations to make relating to the current hours remaining the same, however it is noted the variation seeks to increase the hours for the provision of the following licensable activities;

Live Music

Friday and Saturday 10:00 – 02:30.

(This represents an increase of 1hr 30 mins to what is currently permitted)

Recorded Music

Friday and Saturday 10:00 – 03:00

(This represents an increase of 2hrs to what is currently permitted)

Sale by Retail of Alcohol

Friday and Saturday 10:00 – 02:00

(This represents an increase of 1hr to what is currently permitted)

The application also seeks to vary the non-licensable activity relating to the opening hours of the premises, these being

Thursday and Sunday 10:00 – 02:00

(This represents an increase of 30 mins to what is currently permitted)

Friday and Saturday 10:00 – 03:00

(This represents an increase of 1hr 30 mins to what is currently permitted)

With regards the above variations Lancashire Constabulary would make representations against the granting of the application as they believe it would undermine the licensing objectives of Crime and Disorder and Public Nuisance. The reasons for which are outlined below;

On 15th August 2014 Lancashire Constabulary submitted a review of the premises licence as they believed the premises was undermining the licensing objectives of Crime and Disorder and Public Nuisance.

The grounds for the review were that there were a number of incidents associated with the premises which in turn led to reports of assault and there was nuisance caused to local residents who were being disturbed in the early hours of the morning by what was perceived to be customers leaving the premises.

On Monday 6th October 2014 a hearing was held at South Ribble Borough Council to determine the review application. Prior to the hearing an agreement was reached with the operator which reduced hours for licensable activities and imposed additional conditions which were felt necessary to promote the licensing objectives.

After hearing presentations from both sides and representations from local residents the licensing committee decided to impose the amendments to the licence as agreed. These amendments are reflected within the current premises licence.

Since the hearing Lancashire Constabulary would say that the premises have not had any issues associated with it and that this is in the main to the fact that the reduction in hours and additional conditions has had the desired effect.

This application seeks to revert the licence to its operating hours pre the review and there is a real concern that should the licence be amended as requested in the application this could lead to a re-occurrence of problems related to the premises and disturbance to local residents.

Lancashire Constabulary can see no reason for the licensing committee to amend their previous decision.

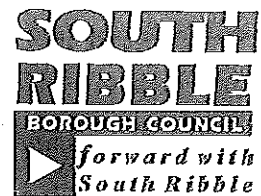

The application was determined on 6th October 2014, when the reduced permitted hours were applied to the Licence.

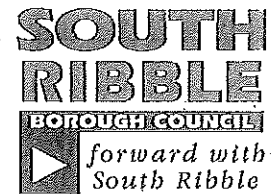

21.07.2014 - 'for the last few weeks they have been disturbed by people coming back from the pub - shouting fighting etc. at all hours even up to 3 am in the morning at weekends - on Sunday night (20th) there was an incident of fighting and the police were called.

Environmental Health, however, have not recorded any resident complaints about this type of disturbance since the premises hours were amended following a review in 2014. I feel very strongly that the Premises License for Barristers should not be reviewed. The opening hours should stay as they are now or even be reduced.

Since their opening hours were reduced in October 2014 there has been much less antisocial behaviour and damage on Friday and Saturday nights. If the hours are extended we will just experience the same problems as before which I have detailed below.

To Prevent Public Nuisance

I live just a few minutes away from Barristers on Spring Gardens which is a main route home for many of their customers in the early hours of the morning. This is particularly obvious Fridays and Saturdays due to noise and drunken behaviour.

Shouting, screaming, fighting and foul language are a regular occurrence between approximately midnight and 3am as they are throwing bottles and cans into hedges and front gardens and using the street as a public toilet.

To Prevent Crime and Disorder

My car has been damaged on several occasions which have been reported to the police including damage to a wing mirror, the rear wiper being ripped off the car and the car bonnet being sprayed with a sticky foam.

Two of my close neighbours have had their front garden fences damaged by being 'kicked-in'. Glass bottles are smashed in the street and broken glass left in the street and on the pavement.

I work full-time during the week and look forward to the weekends but it will be difficult to relax and sleep at night if Barrister's licensing hours are extended again. We will just experience the same antisocial behaviour which I believe is caused by overly extended licensing hours which allows large amounts of alcohol to be consumed on the premises.
