



Procedure for all hearings before Licensing Panel to determine applications made under the Licensing Act 2003

Preliminary Points

It has been agreed by Licensing Committee that, in addition to the Declaration of any personal or prejudicial interest (in accordance with the Local Government Act 2000):-

- Any member in whose ward an application premises is situated will declare this and will not take any further part in the hearing of the application
- Any member of a Licensing Panel who wishes to either support or oppose the granting of a licence either personally or on behalf of their constituents, must attend either as a supporter of the application or as an objector and sit in the public gallery. The panel on which that member serves may not hear the application
- Subject to section 100A of the Local Government Act 1972, the panel may exclude the public from all or part of a hearing where it considers that the public interest in doing so outweighs the public interest in the hearing, or that part of the hearing, taking place in public. This will include, at the discretion of the panel the exclusion of the public during its deliberations and its decision making.

Hearing Process

- 1) General Introduction by Chairman.
- 2) In accordance with the Regulation 23 of The Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005 the Chairman of the panel will lead the discussion.
- 3) A Licensing Officer will briefly outline the application for the licence and the procedure to be followed in the hearing.
- 4) Applicant(s) Case

The objector(s) and/or their representatives and the panel may ask questions of the applicant and/or their representatives.

- 5) Objector(s) Case(s)

The applicant and/or their representatives and the panel may ask questions of the objector(s) and/or their representatives.

- 6) The Chairman will then ask the applicant if, in light of the representations, they wish to amend the application. The panel will only consider the application laid before it during the decision making.

- 7) Summing up;
- i) Objector(s) Case(s)
 - ii) Applicant(s) Case

8) Conclusion

The Chairman will ask the Licensing Authority Legal Representative whether there are any other matters to be raised or resolved before the hearing is closed for deliberations.

9) Deliberations

Generally speaking the public and the applicant will be excluded when the panel is determining the hearing decision. Once a decision has been reached all parties will be readmitted to the hearing. At this stage the chairman will announce the panel's decision and will give reasons for the decision.

10) Notice of Decision

All parties will be notified of the decision at the earliest possible opportunity.

Statement to Page 15 of the Application to Vary a Premises Licence

Following a review of the Premises Licence (PREMA0089) on the 6th October 2014, the following conditions were imposed on the Premises Licence;

1. The Premises Licence Holder or his representative will employ a minimum of 4 door supervisors at the premises on Friday and Saturday from 22:00hrs until the premises are closed and customers have dispersed from the area.
2. There shall be no entry to the premises to customers after midnight on Friday and Saturday.
3. Customers shall be prevented from smoking or drinking at the front of the premises at any time. Smoking should take place in the designated area within the beer garden.

The Premises Licence Holder and Designated Premises Supervisor is now seeking to remove all three of the conditions listed above, on the basis, that the removal of the conditions imposed on the premises licence, will not be in anyway, adverse to the licensing objectives described below.

Since the review, the licensee and owner of the premises, has been re-appointed as the Designated Premises Supervisor, which will provide re-assurance that the licensing objectives will be upheld.

The re-appointed Designated Premises Supervisor has been a licensee for over 17 years and has run over 17 pubs. Given the re-appointed Designated Premises Supervisors level of experience, there is no longer a need for all three of the conditions listed above, to remain in force.

Following the re-appointment of the Designated Premises Supervisor, there have been no incidents concerning anything in relation to; crime and disorder, public safety or public nuisance.

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

SIA approved staff are used on Sunday, though there is no requirement for this.

There is no evidence to support that the conditions imposed on the premises licence, will prevent crime and disorder.

Public Safety

Since the review CCTV with audio has been installed around the perimeter of the premises. Furthermore, fire and health and safety risk assessments are regularly conducted, there are frequent staff inspections of toilets, frequent staff training and an up-to-date non-admission book is kept.

Prevention of Public Nuisance

SIA approved staff are used on Sunday, though there is no requirement for this.

There is no evidence to support that the conditions imposed on the premises licence, will prevent public nuisance.

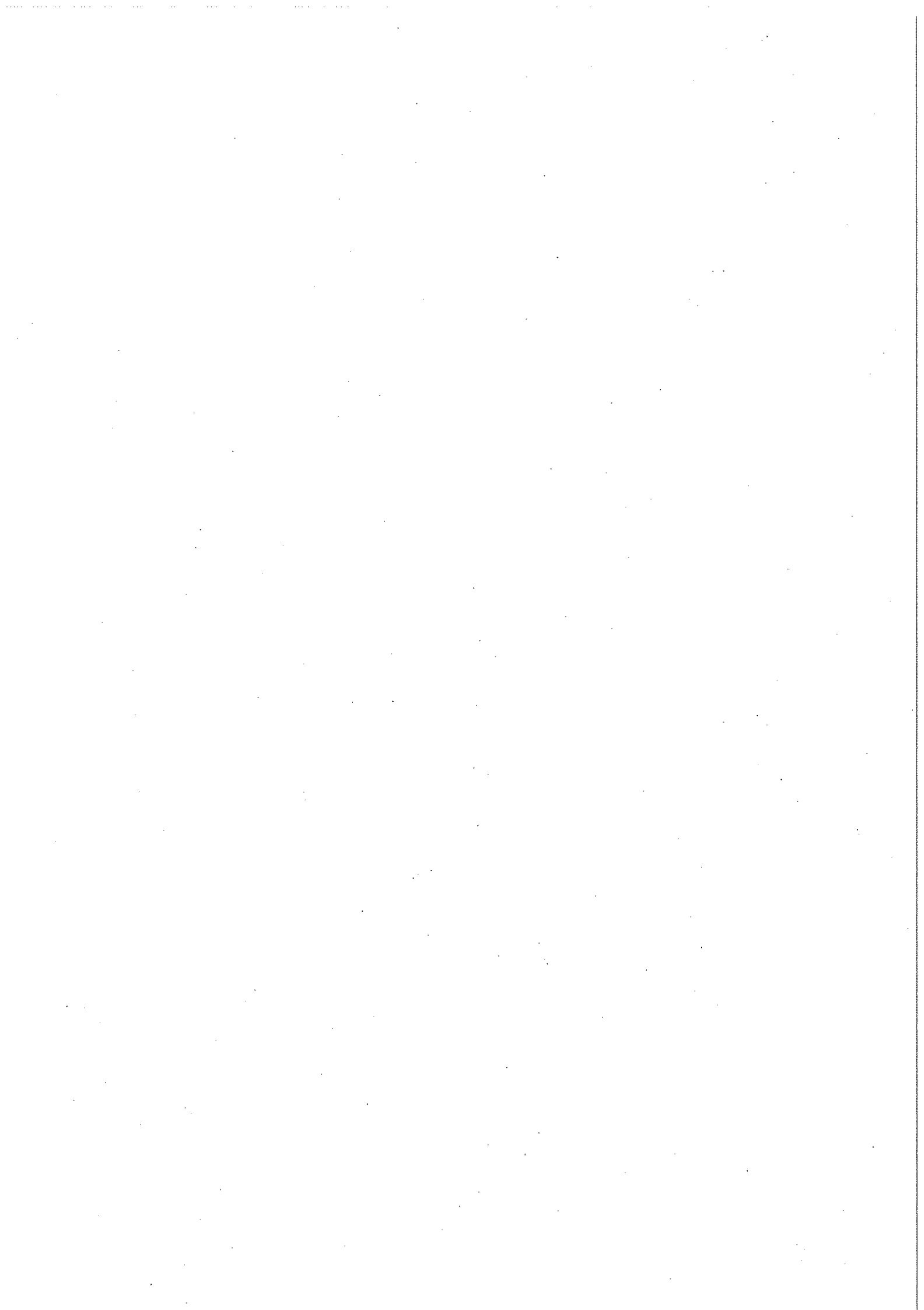

RE: Section 34 Licensing Act - Barristers, 63-65 Towngate, Leyland

We are in receipt of an application under Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003 to vary the premises licence at Barristers, 63-65 Towngate, Leyland.

The application seeks to remove three conditions attached to the premises licence as a result of a licensing review held at South Ribble Borough Council on Monday 6th October 2014.

The review was submitted by the police on 15th August 2015 on the grounds that the premises were undermining the licensing objectives of the Prevention of Crime and Disorder and the Prevention of Public Nuisance.

The condition the applicant seeks to remove are set out below;

1. The Premises Licence Holder or his representative will employ a minimum of 4 door supervisors at the premises on Friday and Saturday from 22:00 hrs until the premises are closed and customers have dispersed from the area.
2. There shall be no entry to the premises to customers after midnight on Friday and Saturday.
3. Customers shall be prevented from smoking or drinking at the front of the premises at any time. Smoking should take place in the designated area within the beer garden.

These conditions were part of the police recommendations contained within the review application and consent was given by the Premises Licence Holder, prior to the review hearing, that the conditions could be imposed onto the licence.

The licensing committee subsequently imposed the recommendations and amended the licence accordingly.

As these conditions were agreed by the Premises Licence Holder and imposed by the licensing committee the police see no reason for them to be removed.

The police feel that these sanctions appeared to have worked and feel that their removal would undermine the licensing objectives of Crime and Disorder and Public Nuisance and to this end the police would make representations against this application.

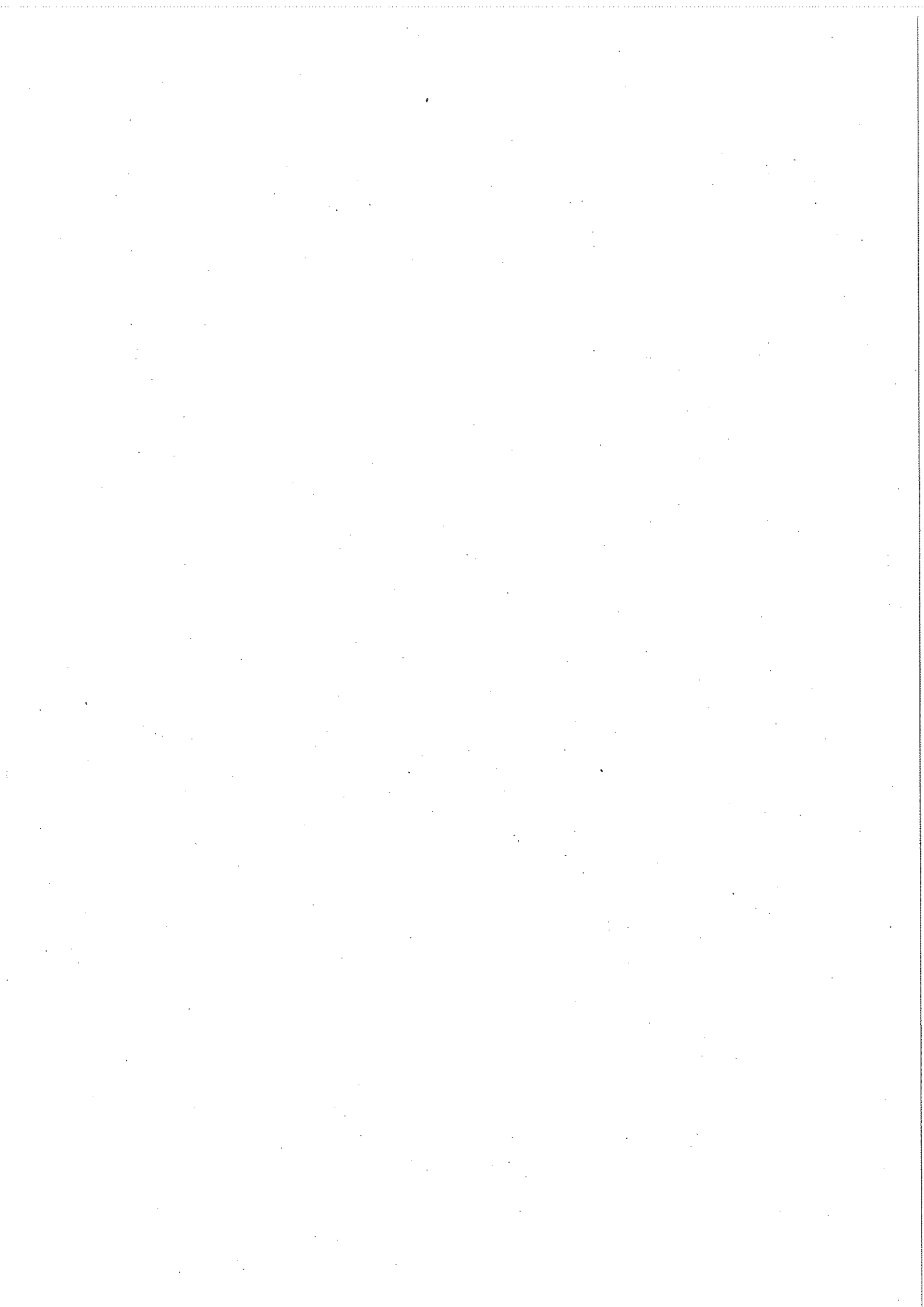

At this point in the meeting Darren Miller stated when he has issues within the Barristers he doesn't bother calling the police and he gets his "HEAVIES" from Bolton "they are here in 20 mins and sort it out". I intervened stating that police should always be called if necessary and it is not acceptable to act in this way. Darren Millar just ignored what I was saying and continued naming the individuals he wanted banning.

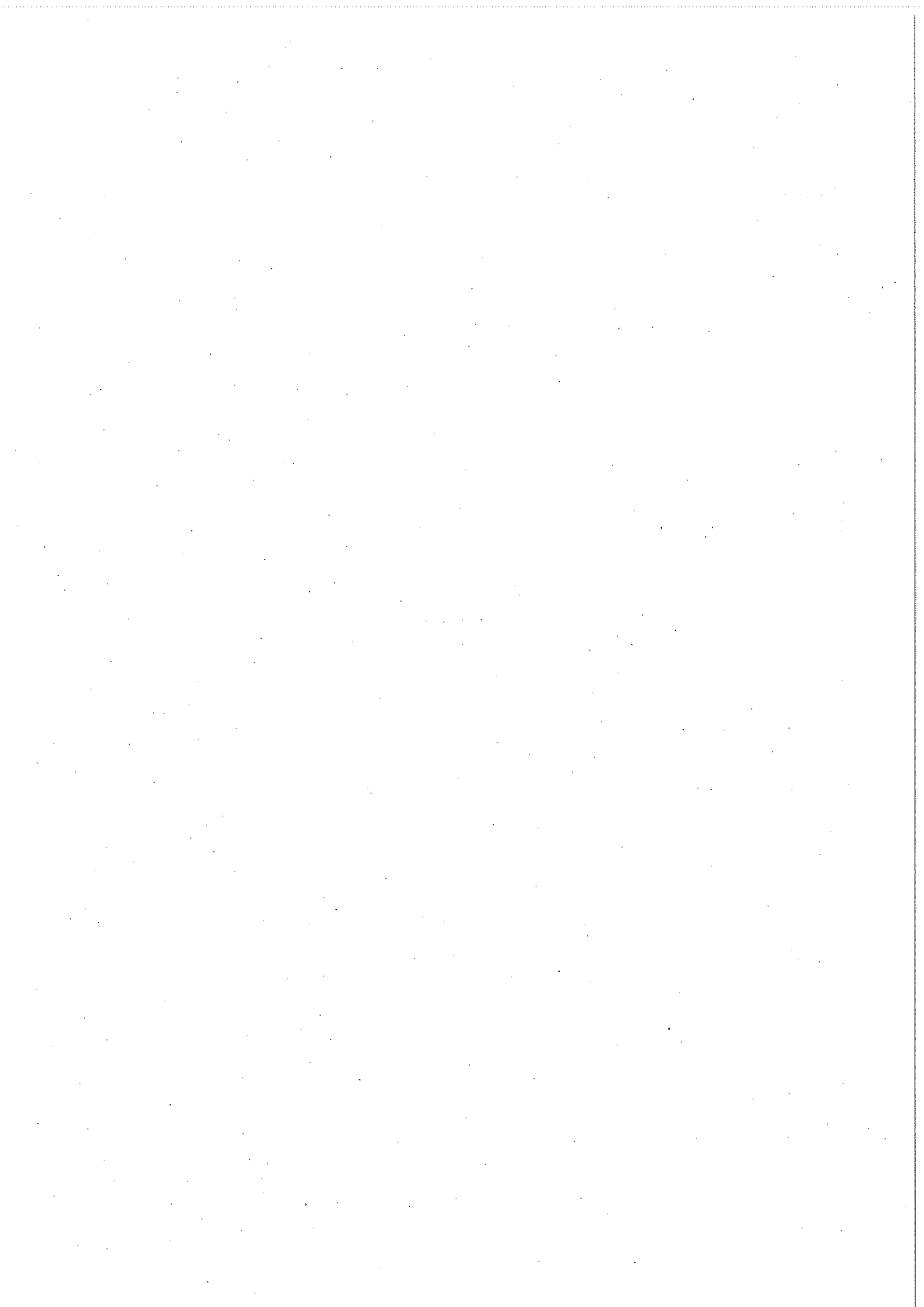
The meeting closed a short time later.

I have received a copy of a further application from Atticus Law on behalf of Barristers Public House seeking to remove a number of conditions from the above Premises Licence.

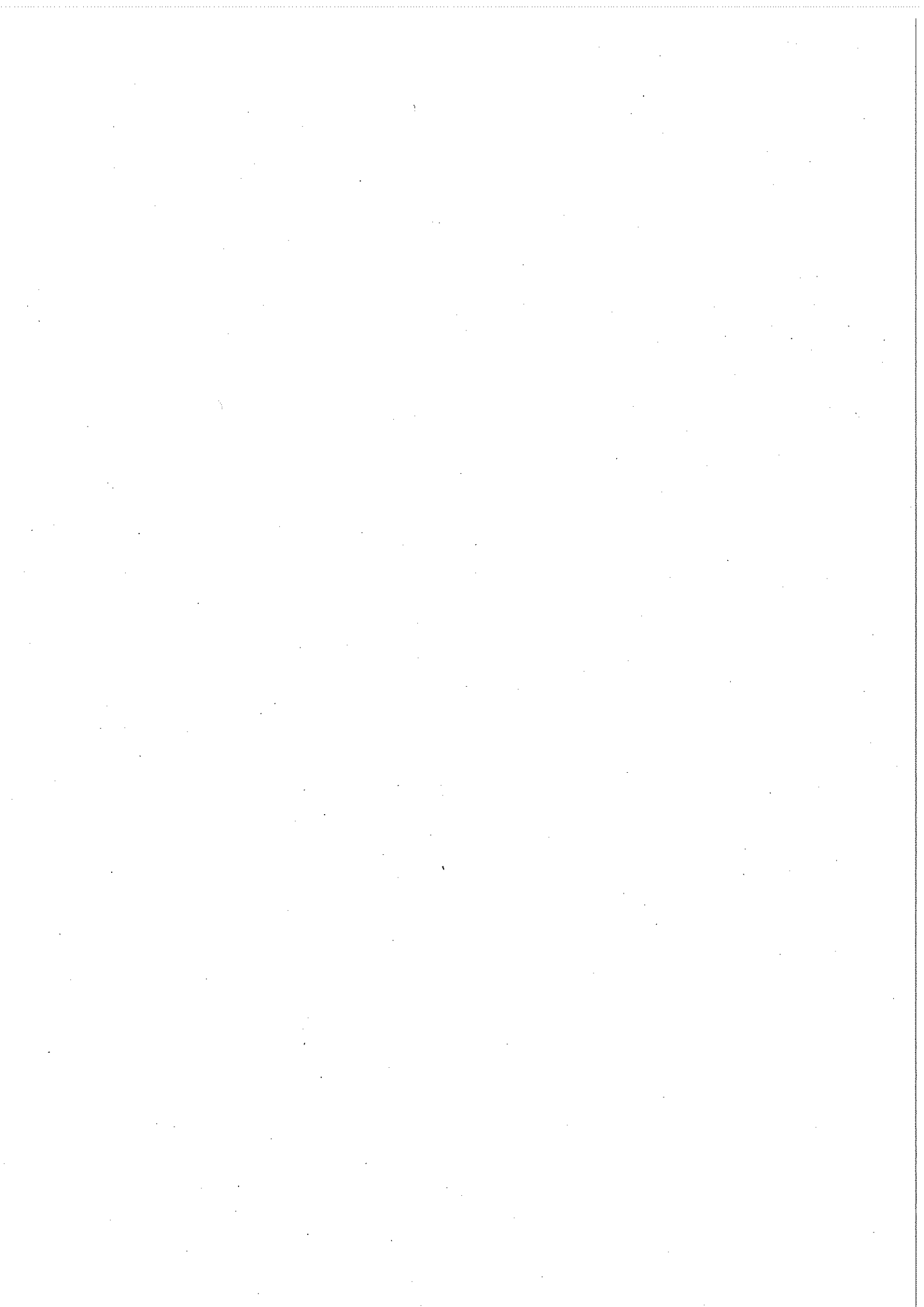
The applicant wishes to remove all of the conditions in Annex 3 to the licence, being those imposed by the Licensing Authority at the review hearing in October 2014.

The application states that there is no evidence to support that the conditions imposed on the licence will prevent crime and disorder or public nuisance, however, the applicant also points out that there have been no reported incidents since that time, which I would argue provides clear evidence that the controls imposed by the Licensing Authority have been entirely effective.

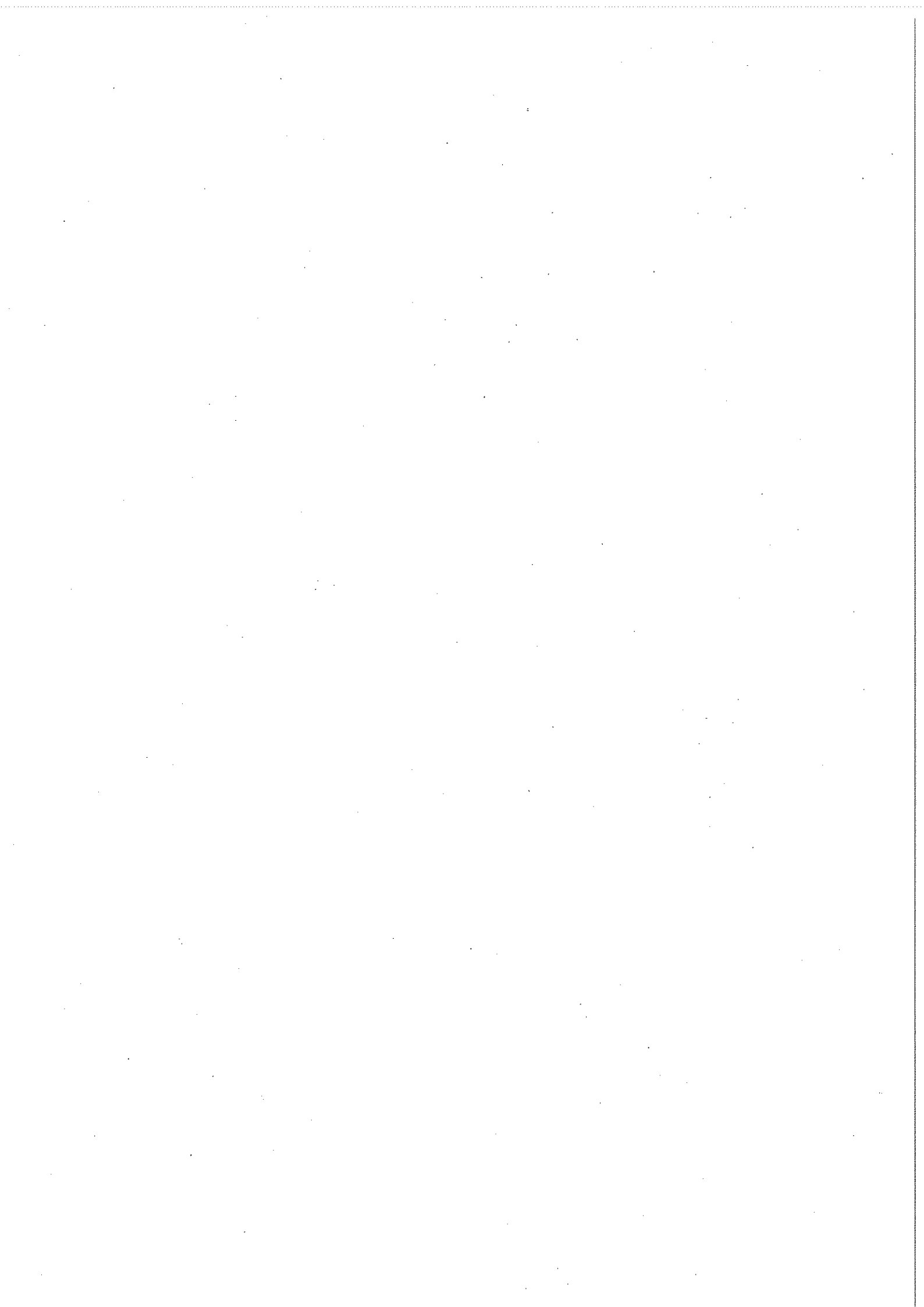
It is fair to say that since that time, the Licensing Authority has not received any formal complaints about nuisance or disorder linked to these premises, however, I would submit that is due to the effectiveness of the revised licence.

Further to the above application to remove conditions imposed on the premises license. The Environmental Health department objects to the remove of the conditions.

The applicant states that the removal of the three conditions will not have any adverse impact on the licensing objectives.

Condition 1 - provision of door supervisors, the applicant states that door supervisors are employed on Sundays. I don't understand how the employment of door staff on a Sunday has any bearing on the prevention of crime and disorder or public nuisance on a Friday and Saturday. Other than to demonstrate that if staff are still required on a quieter Sunday night then they are almost definitely required on a Friday and Saturday night.

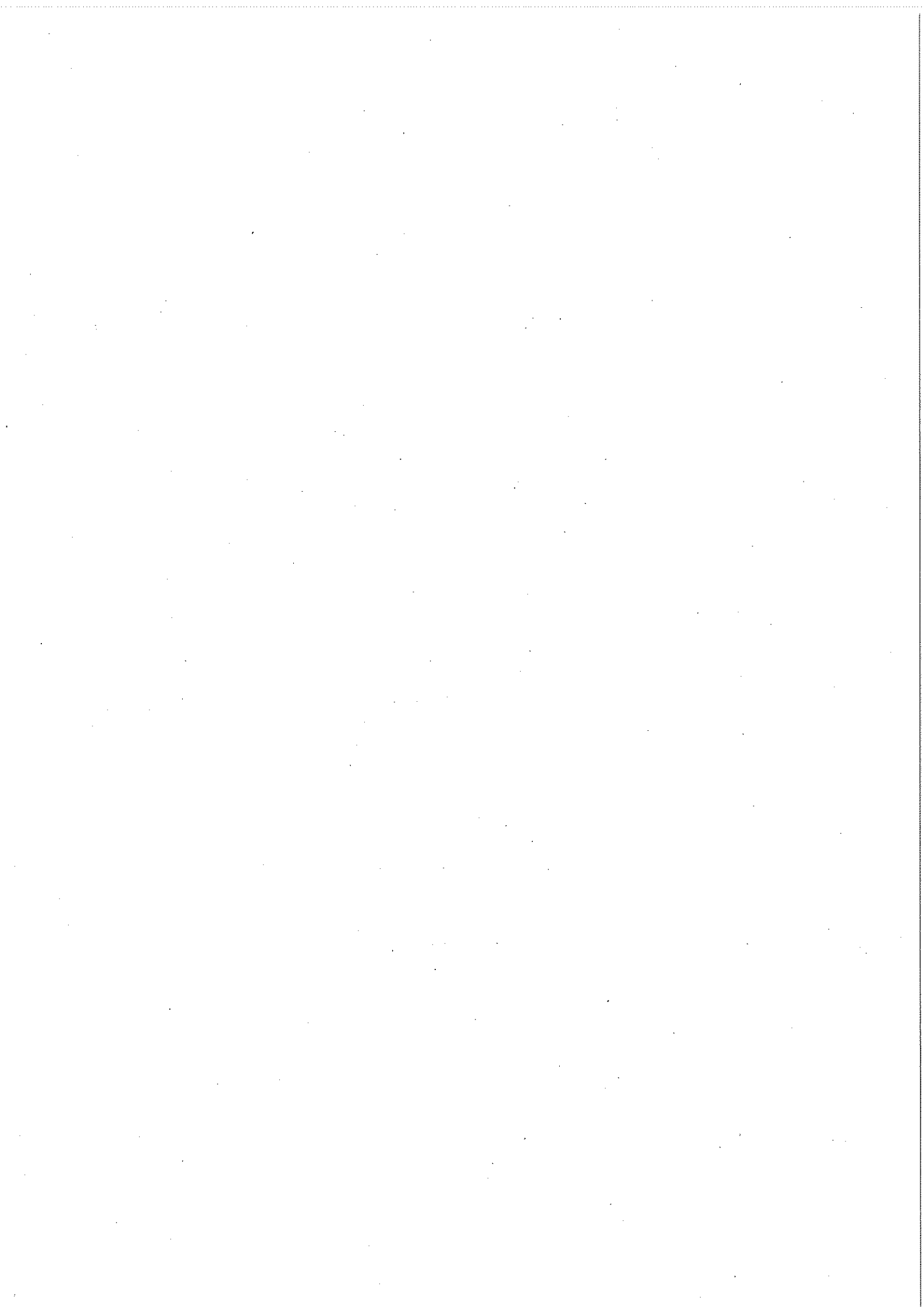
I can confirm that 2 complaints have been lodged with the department following the change of premises licence holder in 2014, the first relating to noise and general anti-social behaviour and the second in relation to shouting and fighting outside the pub.

Condition 2 - entry after midnight. The applicant has not provided any specific reasoning for the removal of this condition other than a general statement that the condition will prevent public nuisance and the prevention of crime and disorder.

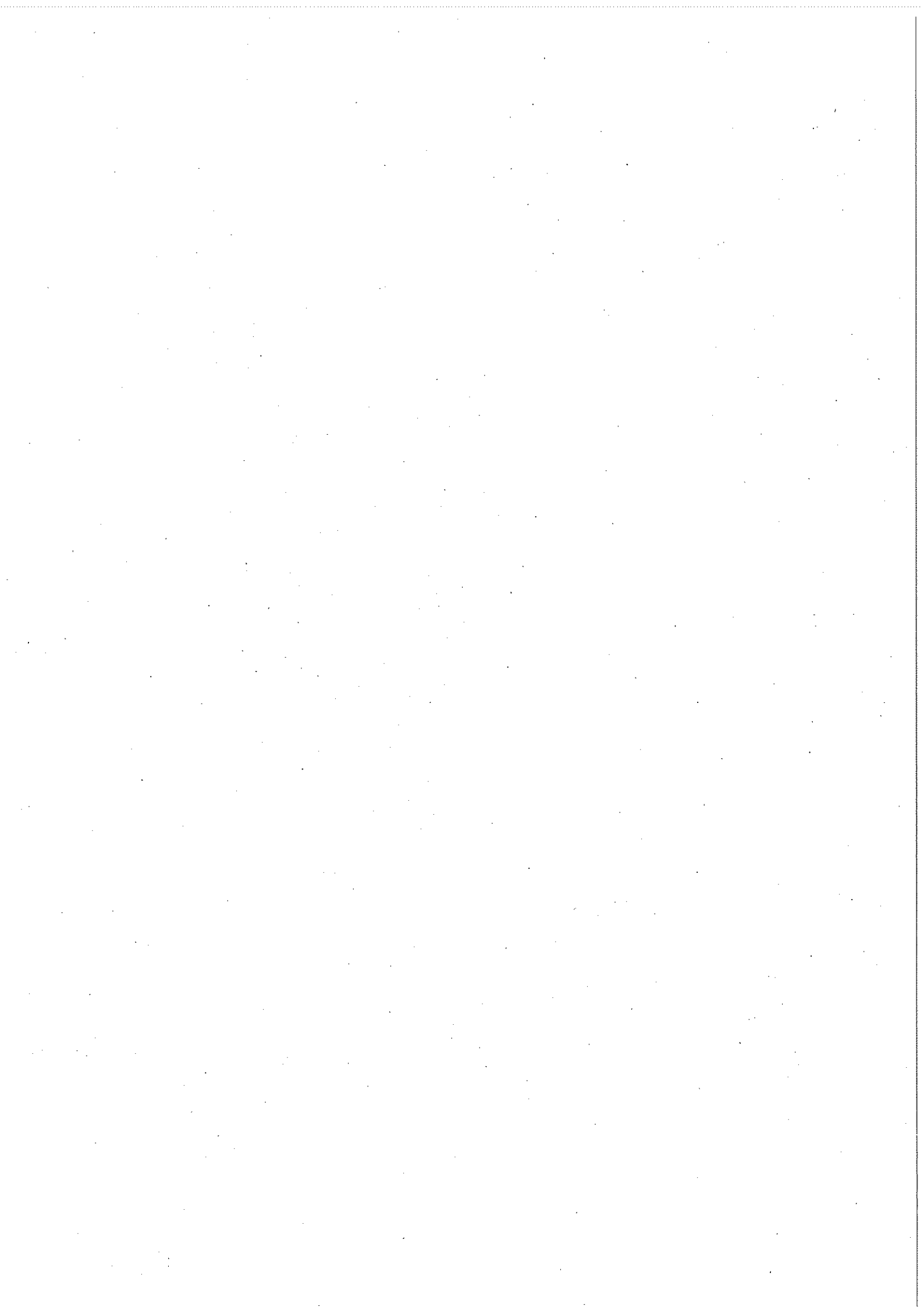
Condition 3 - no smoking or drinking at the front of the building. Again no specific information has been provided to justify the removal of this condition. The prevention of drinking and smoking on the public highway will help to reduce the incidents of public disorder, and public safety as the footpath will not be obstructed for passing pedestrians.
