

SUB COMMITTEE LICENSING HEARING IN
RESPECT OF PREMISES LICENCE
APPLICATION FOR HUTCH – 171B LIVERPOOL
ROAD, HUTTON

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Preliminary Points

It has been agreed by Licensing Committee that, in addition to the Declaration of any personal or prejudicial interest (in accordance with the Local Government Act 2000):-

- Any member in whose ward an application premises is situated will declare this and will not take any further part in the hearing of the application
- Any member of a Licensing Panel who wishes to either support or oppose the granting of a licence either personally or on behalf of their constituents, must attend either as a supporter of the application or as an objector and sit in the public gallery. The panel on which that member serves may not hear the application
- Subject to section 100A of the Local Government Act 1972, the panel may exclude the public from all or part of a hearing where it considers that the public interest in doing so outweighs the public interest in the hearing, or that part of the hearing, taking place in public. This will include, at the discretion of the panel the exclusion of the public during its deliberations and its decision making.

Hearing Process

- 1) General Introduction by Chairman.
- 2) In accordance with the Regulation 23 of The Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005 the Chairman of the panel will lead the discussion.
- 3) A Licensing Officer will briefly outline the application for the licence and the procedure to be followed in the hearing.
- 4) Applicant(s) Case

The objector(s) and/or their representatives and the panel may ask questions of the applicant and/or their representatives.

- 5) Objector(s) Case(s)

The applicant and/or their representatives and the panel may ask questions of the objector(s) and/or their representatives.

- 6) The Chairman will then ask the applicant if, in light of the representations, they wish to amend the application. The panel will only consider the application laid before it during the decision making.

- 7) Summing up;
 - i) Objector(s) Case(s)
 - ii) Applicant(s) Case

- 8) Conclusion

The Chairman will ask the Licensing Authority Legal Representative whether there are any other matters to be raised or resolved before the hearing is closed for deliberations.

- 9) Deliberations

Generally speaking the public and the applicant will be excluded when the panel is determining the hearing decision. Once a decision has been reached all parties will be readmitted to the hearing. At this stage the chairman will announce the panel's decision and will give reasons for the decision.

- 10) Notice of Decision

All parties will be notified of the decision at the earliest possible opportunity.

SUMMARY AND LINK TO CORPORATE PRIORITIES

An application was submitted by Miss Donna Lambert, of 133 Longacre Lane, Bamber Bridge, Preston PR5 8HH on the 13th May 2016 for a new premise licence under Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003, in respect of the Premises known as Hutch, 171b Liverpool Road, Hutton, Preston PR4 5FE

The application could have an impact on several of the Council's Corporate Priorities. It should be borne in mind however, that the application must be determined in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003, Council's Licensing Policy Statement and the statutory guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The panel conduct the hearing in accordance with the hearing procedure and decide accordingly.

DETAILS AND REASONING

Miss Lambert made an application on the 13th May 2016 for the grant of a new premises licence to cover the licensable activity of 'supply of alcohol'
Attached is a copy of the Application form submitted by Miss Lambert

In short Miss Lambert wishes to open a Café to serve Alcohol from 11am until 22:30pm Monday to Thursday and from 11am until 00:30am Friday to Sunday.

Representations from Responsible Authorities

The Responsible Authorities have no objections in respect of the application.

Representations from other Interested Parties

There have been six representations from other parties including a petition with a lead petitioner who all appear to be local residents. They have raised issues in respect of possible public nuisance, public safety, crime and disorder and the prevention of Harm to Children around the premises.

All the evidence will be considered and a decision will be made as to whether or not the application shall be granted and if granted, whether any additional conditions or restrictions shall apply.

Licensing Act 2003

The Council must carry out its licensing functions with the intention of promoting the licensing objectives.

The licensing objectives are:-

- a) The prevention of crime and disorder;
- b) Public safety;
- c) The prevention of public nuisance; and
- d) The protection of children from harm.

The Council must also have regard to:

1. Its own Policy Statement;
2. Secretary of State guidance (Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003).

The Legislation

Under Section 18 Licensing Act 2003 where relevant representations are made to an application for a premises licence, the authority must hold a hearing to consider them. The Authority must have regard to the application and any relevant representations and take such steps (as are outlined below)... if any, as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

The steps are:-

- a. to grant the licence subject to the inclusion of such conditions and permitted hours as it sees fit
- b. to reject the application

The Hearing will be carried out in accordance with our normal hearings procedure

The Proof of Age Standards Scheme (PASS) will be actively promoted at the premises by the display of Challenge 25 posters bearing the PASS logo. A PASS accredited holographic proof of age card will be the main identification document accepted at the premises as proof of age. A PASS card must be accepted as proof of age if a purchaser possesses

Representation

171b Liverpool Road, Hutton, Preston, PR4 5FE - 'Hutch' - Application for a Premises Licence for the consumption of Alcohol

We write in connection with the above licence application for the consumption of alcohol Sun to Thurs 11.00-22.30 and Fri to Sat 11.00-0030. With opening hours Sun to Thurs 11.00-23.00 and Fri to Sat 11.00-01.00. We live directly across the road of Stiles Avenue from the proposed premises with outside seating area and we want to object strongly to the proposed application based upon the following reasons:

The Prevention of Harm to Children:

We have a 20 month old Granddaughter staying with us and she sleeps in the upstairs back bedroom directly at the side of the premises relating to this application. We feel that her sleep pattern will be disrupted, especially in the evening and early hours of the morning, because of the noise from people drinking and shouting outside and also the artificial lighting that is on the side of the property, and that this will have a negative effect on her emotional well-being. We also have grave concerns about the prevention of harm to local school children coming home from school due to the extra vehicles driving and parking in and around the area of the premises. At the moment vehicular movement during school hours is a nightmare and we have witnessed vehicles pulling out in front of children walking and cycling home from Hutton Grammar School. With the extra vehicles parking and driving to and from the premises we are extremely concerned that an accident may happen involving a child or young student.

To Prevent Public Nuisance

We believe that granting a licence to serve alcohol into the late evening and early hours is entirely inappropriate in a quiet residential area such as Hutton, and there is a potential and a serious risk for increased noise and anti-social behaviour. The outdoor seating area will make matters worse especially during the summer months because it is adjacent to local residents' gardens and in open view of many children's bedrooms. The application states limited use of the outdoor space and the late licence unless the venue becomes popular!!! We feel that due to police cutbacks the outdoor use could be easily breached and abused by patrons leaving the premises late at night or in the early hours of the morning intoxicated and being very loud and shouting and swearing and slamming car doors, without any respect or regard to this quiet peaceful residential village. This disruption may also have an emotional affect on the well being of the children and young people residing in Hutton.

To Prevent Crime and Disorder

Hutton village is a quiet residential area with low crime and disorder figures. But with the proposed late night and early hours of the morning for the consumption of alcohol may well result in an increase in crime and disorder. Any aggressive behaviour caused by people being intoxicated could result in damage to vehicles and property around and nearby the premises, and also may cause danger and compromise the safety of local residents, children and young people.

Public Safety

People visiting the premises will probably arrive by car and as we feel that there is already an existing problem with parking for the local shops and visitors to the proposed premises may well cause significant parking issues outside the premises and along Stiles Avenue, which is a quiet residential estate. Cars are often parked illegally on the footpath and obstructing the wheelchair and pushchair access. This is made worse when the local school finishes in the afternoon, so the extra vehicles using the premises in question will just add to the parking problems on Stiles Avenue and along the main road on Liverpool Road. Many children pass by this junction and the premises subject of the application both on bicycle and on foot prior to and after school. We have serious and grave concern of risk to life for these children. There is only limited parking for these premises (3 or 4 vehicles) which may be taken by members of staff or the tenant living above the premises. Vehicles already drive and park on the footpath outside the premises in question and therefore further vehicular activity around these premises would exceed available parking spaces, thereby creating further cause for concern for the public safety for motorists, pedestrians, children and the residents of Hutton.

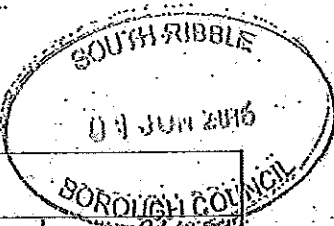

We write in connection with the above licence application. We live directly opposite the proposed café / outside seating area of this establishment and we absolutely object to the proposed application based upon the following reasons.

The Prevention of Harm to Children

- 1) We have three boys aged 11, eight and four years old. Our eight year old sleeps in the downstairs bedroom directly opposite the café seating area and our four year old sleeps upstairs, again directly opposite this proposed seating area. We object to the proposed evening openings because we believe our sons will detrimentally lose sleep. They will be subjected to the negative effect of the consumption of alcohol: shouting, swearing, general raised noise levels; smoking, potential aggressive behaviour; witnessing vomiting and urination near to our property. Clearly, this will have a negative impact upon their wellbeing and this is the main reason why we object.

To Prevent Public Nuisance

We have lived in Hutton for eight years. It is a quiet, tranquil village with very little crime along with the added benefit of having an outstanding school and therefore the reason for us buying our property. We believe the tenor and atmosphere of the village will change – the outdoor seated area if used in the evenings will attract a range of problems related to public nuisance:

- 1) The noise levels in the area will automatically increase through vehicles and customers using the premises; through late night taxis picking up drunken (loud) passengers; through the noise of those customers who by drinking will naturally become louder and potentially through the music that may be used to entertain these customers. A party atmosphere for those attending functions weekend after weekend is not conducive to the residents of Hutton in a quiet, residential area.
- 2) Already the seated / walled area has attracted local teenagers who are now using this as a 'hangout' in the evenings. Again, this is an unforeseen consequence, but one which has had an adverse impact upon us in terms of increased noise and litter. Potentially, the litter caused from the café itself, through food, beverages and through smoking, will lead to creating a negative impression of this village and will invite rats.
- 3) Crime will undoubtedly increase through the increased alcohol consumption which will lead to anti-social behaviour. During the evening and in the Summer months, those standing / seated outside of the premises may behave in a rowdy, objectionable manner to local residents – who perhaps would like to go to sleep and do not want to be listening to the depraved ramblings of incoherent drinkers.
- 4) The lighting of the outside area and potentially the music from the café itself will have an impact on the front of our property and the surrounding homes. This may also hinder our children's sleep.

To Prevent Crime and Disorder

- 1) Due to the proposed evening opening hours and consumption of alcohol this could result in intoxication and aggressive behaviour to other users of the premises or to the residents of Hutton. Crime may also be caused through damage to vehicles and property due to the drunken behaviour of those upon leaving the establishment.

Public Safety

- 1) As a result of the proposed application for late opening hours and the consumption of alcohol public safety will be an issue. The increased levels of traffic and parking may cause accidents to take place as the potential parking area will be directly in front of our house or on Styles Avenue. Our property is positioned on a blind bend and as a consequence accidents may occur for those crossing the road between parked cars or indeed for our family, trying to leave our property. Fore mostly, parking on or near to Styles Avenue will lead to major problems for those residents who live closest to this.
- 2) The disorder caused by drunken behaviour is also a matter of public safety as well as damaging the reputation of the area. Whilst the owners of 171b Liverpool Road may claim to want an 'upmarket' establishment – their reason for business is to make as much profit as possible, therefore the consequences of late night drinking are not of their concern once customers have left their establishment. Our concern is the effect to public safety when people leave – of the potential for assault and other crimes associated with drunken behaviour that will now have a severe impact upon the residents of Hutton.



I write in connection with the above licence application. I am a local resident and have recently moved to the area. I wish to object strongly to the proposed application based on the following objectives.

The Prevention of Harm to Children.

- 1) I have a 5 year old boy and am concerned that the opening of the above premises with the option of serving alcohol until late could have a negative effect on my son as a direct result of seeing continual drinking of alcohol at the above premises which is directly opposite our property. This would be made worse in summer months when users would be seated outside drinking and smoking. Furthermore I am concerned my child could be subjected to hearing strong language or sexual expletives from across the road especially when users have consumed excessive alcohol.

To Prevent Public Nuisance

As a resident of 164 Liverpool Road we are located directly opposite the premises which have made an application to acquire a late licence to serve alcohol. We have recently moved to the area and have a 5 year old boy. The attraction to this area was accessibility to excellent schools as well as the tranquillity of Hutton Village. We fear this tranquillity could be disturbed by the above application and that the activity of the above proposed 'late license will affect our rights as residents of the area and consequently cause varying degrees of public nuisance such as the following:

- 1) The time of night which these premises will be open until will directly affect the tranquillity of our evening as well as other residents within the area. This will be caused directly by entertainment noise and /or crowd noise especially in summer months with the outdoor seating area. Furthermore there will be the impact of indirect noise such as an increase of vehicles such as taxis to and from the premises until late at night which will affect our sleep and that of my child. In addition to this there may be events being held at the premises such as the room being hired for a party which will again affect the tranquillity of the area and result in an increase in noise.
- 2) I am concerned that the above licensed business could cause public nuisance from litter and waste caused by an increase in footfall to the above premises as well as the immediate area and once users of the premises drink outside in the seating area the premises may decide to offer 'plastic' drinking cups which will be left on tables and on walls and blown along the street. Furthermore users of the above premises may be served food to consume outside late at night and again this could be left on the table at the end of their evening and not collected and therefore left to be blown in to the street .e.g. Crisp packets. Furthermore the outdoor seating area will encourage smokers to appear which again could cause waste from empty cigarette packets and again which could be blown or dropped on to the floor.

- 3) With extended drinking hours and possible increased alcohol consumption, the potential for anti social behaviour is much greater. Within Hutton there were 27 reported incidents of anti-social behaviour in March 2016 according to Police UK (<https://www.streetcheck.co.uk/crime/pr45hb>). I am concerned that with extended opening hours being proposed and the availability and consumption of alcohol at the above premises this could potential cause rowdy behaviour especially in the summer months when users are within the seating area at the side of the property. Furthermore if this seating area becomes busy, users will inevitably stand outside the front of the premises drinking, smoking and more than likely becoming louder. When leaving the premises at night, users who would have consumed too much alcohol could urinate and vomit in the street.

The potential for this premises becoming a public nuisance as a direct result of late opening times and consumption of alcohol is much greater and furthermore this could have a very negative impact on the school children from Hutton Grammar school when walking past the premises after school or during lunch periods and seeing groups of individuals drinking.

Uncontrolled litter, waste and street fouling is unsightly and I believe will lead to a negative image of the area. It could attract rats and insects and therefore be a public health risk plus this in turn could affect the reputation of the adjoining and surrounding businesses.

- 4) I am concerned of the light pollution the premises will cause. As a result of late opening hours the lighting will be open until later and in the summer months artificial lighting will, more than likely be provided to the outside seating area which will again have an impact on to the front of my property and the surrounding homes. This light spilling over to the front of my property and other properties will cause annoyance, distraction and discomfort.

To Prevent Crime and Disorder

- 1) As a result of the proposed application for late opening hours and consumption of alcohol this could result in intoxication and aggressive behaviour to other users of the premises. This could result in fighting and / or violent behaviour towards other within the premises or to passersby. Furthermore there is an increased chance of consumption of alcohol in the street and could therefore contribute to crime and disorder towards vehicles or property within the local area.

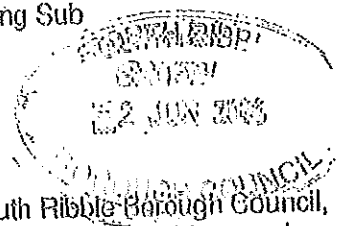

The Prevention of Harm to Children	The application is for a newly built commercial premises attached to an existing block of commercial premises (2 x food premises, 1 x Financial services and 3 x hair and beauty. The area is within a linear residential area surrounded by an estate of over 100 family houses. There are significant amounts of children around the proposed venue for large parts of the day. The premises is located less than 50 metres from the bedrooms of circa 20 children under the age of 12 and therefore there is a risk

	that children could be presented with sights of drinking and smoking throughout the day/night
To prevent Public Nuisance	The area is mostly residential and therefore there is a risk of noise and anti-social behaviour that is statistically proven to be alcohol related. The designated outdoor area is adjacent to residential gardens and in open view of children's bedrooms – there is significant risk of public nuisance through noise and related nuisance. Although the application states limited use of the outdoor space and late license it is our view that with limited ability to police this that the outdoor space and license restrictions could be breached easily this would lead to significant impact on the lives of young children who would be affected by noise and late night activities that do not currently exist
To prevent Crime and Disorder	The premises' postcode and surrounding postcodes are, according to Lancashire constabulary figures, exceedingly low for crime and disorder. This is primarily due to the demographic of the area and the lack of late night or licensed premises. The nearest licensed premises is Hutton Village Hall which very rarely hosts occasions where alcohol is served. By placing a licensed premises within this location there is a risk to an increase in Crime and Disorder associated with licensed premises and with the lack of local policing this is a great concern to us as very local residents to the venue
Public Safety	It has already been noted that there has been significant concern over the parking in place around the existing facilities. There is limited off street parking and people using the commercial premises that are currently there often park in dangerous positions. The road layout, speed of vehicles and presence of School children on bikes also presents further risk to life through poor parking. We would object to the premises if off street parking suitable for the size of the venue is not available. Any further vehicle activity around the current commercial premises would exceed the parking available thus creating even further cause for concern for motorists, pedestrians and, more importantly, children in the area. We have witnessed two serious accidents outside our property one which involved a car being hit and subsequently pushed down our drive and into a tree in our garden which could have be so much worse had our children been stood on the drive. Accidents caused by excessive speed and a difficult road junction – adding further parked vehicles to an already swamped area will only lead to a more serious accident and possibly a threat to life

- Provision of off road parking related to the number of potential customers of the venue

- The restriction on noise/music for the venue with no entertainment passed 18:00

We, the undersigned, as interested parties, wish to make representations in respect of the above application for the following reasons:

THE PREVENTION OF HARM TO CHILDREN

The premises are in close proximity to Hutton Grammar School and a significant number of children pass these premises on a daily basis. The consumption of alcohol at this location, particularly in the outdoor seating area would have a negative impact on these children. There are also many younger children residing within a short distance of these premises and the potential for viewing customers drinking and smoking all day would impact on these children.

TO PREVENT PUBLIC NUISANCE

We believe that granting a licence to serve alcohol into the late evening and early hours is entirely inappropriate in a quiet residential area such as Hutton, and there is real potential for increased noise and anti-social behaviour. The outdoor seating area could make matters far worse, particularly during summer months. Patrons leaving the premises at these late hours may well not do so quietly and may not be respectful of the residential nature of this peaceful area. Noise and nuisance would be inevitable from loud voices of people leaving the premises and the slamming of car doors.

The outdoor seating area is already attracting local teenagers who use the area as a meeting place in the evenings. The consequence is an increase in noise and litter. There is a concern that the premises, when open, may lead to an increase in litter through food packets and smoking which would create a negative image of the village.



There is also concern that the premises may cause light pollution particularly during the evening in the darker months. Any artificial lighting provided for the outdoor seating area would also create light pollution which would cause annoyance and a nuisance to those dwellings overlooking the premises.
