Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

- 1 No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence
 - a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence,

or

- b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2 Every supply of alcohol under the premise licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3 (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either a holographic mark, or an ultraviolet feature.
- 6 The responsible person must ensure that -
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks are sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.
- 7 (1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
 - (2) In this condition:-



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- a. "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula $P = D + (D \times V)$, where
 - i. P is the permitted price,
 - ii. D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - iii. V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- b. "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- c. "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence
 - i. the holder of the premises licence,
 - ii. the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - iii. the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- d. "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- e. "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- (3) Where the permitted price would not be a whole number of pennies, the permitted price shall be taken to be the price rounded up to the nearest penny.
- (4) Where the permitted price on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax, the permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 1 Experienced qualified Manager
- 2 SIA approved door staff member to be used at discretion of Manager/DPS to maintain safe operation of venue.
- The premises shall operate and maintain a CCTV system which shall be in use during all times licensable activities are taking place at the premises and comply as follows:
 - a) The system shall cover all entrances and exits of the premises, in addition to covering areas of the premises used to store alcohol.
 - b) The focus of the camera(s) shall be so as to enable clear identification of persons on the premises.
 - c) The system will be capable of time and date stamping recordings and retaining said recordings for at least 28 days.
 - d) The Data Controller shall make footage available to a Police Officer or authorised officer, where such a request is made in accordance with the Data Protection Act 1998.
 - e) CCTV system installed covering all relevant areas, kept for 28 days on a format



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acceptable to all enforcement and authorised agencies.

- Drink aware recommendations to be in place and member of any local pub watch Group.
- 5 Fire Risk assessment done and available for inspection.
- 6 Manager or nominated staff member to attend and actively participate in any local recognised pub watch schemes.
- An incident book / refusals register shall be kept and maintained at the premises which will record details of all refusals and any incidents of crime and disorder at the premises and will be made available to the Police and Licensing Authority for inspection on request.
- Only persons who are 18 years of age and over shall be able to sell or supply alcohol. All staff members will receive training in relation to age related sales, Check 25 policy and the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. Records of this training will be kept on the premises and produced to the Police, Trading Standards of Local Authority Enforcement Officers. All staff will be trained in regards to safe drinking and will be regularly checked for compliance.
- Any outside area to be used by patrons for drinking, smoking, etc., shall be restricted to the area immediately outside the building facing Liverpool Road. This area shall only be used between the hours of 1100 hours to 2200 Monday to Saturday and 1100 to 2100 hours Sunday and Bank Holidays. At no time shall the garden area to the West be used by patrons. There shall be no flood lighting or heaters installed in the outside area without prior consent from the Local Planning Authority.
- 10 All staff will receive guidance on Food Safety, allergies and similar.
- Local Taxi companies to be encouraged to leave contact details in premises to assist in safe passage home of customers. Taxi liaison point to be identified and request made to companies not to sound horns or slam doors after 2200hrs.
- Signage to be place at all exit points requesting customers leave quietly and show respect for neighbours.
- Windows and doors to the premises shall be kept closed from 13:00 hours each day the premises is open. After 13:00 hours the doors to the premises shall be kept closed and shall only be used for access into and out of the building i.e. shall not be propped open. The entrance used by the public shall be of a vestibule (lobby) construction with self-closers fitted to both sets of doors, this is to prevent noise break out. The premises, including the bar and kitchen, shall be provided with suitable mechanical ventilation which will prevent the need for doors and windows to be opened.
- 14. Pub watch members if applicable.
- 15 Venue soundproofed and acoustic glass placed in all windows.
- A documented Challenge 25 scheme will be operated at the premises. The Challenge 25 scheme will be actively promoted and advertised at the premises and any person purchasing alcohol who appears to be under 25 years of age, shall be asked to provide acceptable identification to prove that they are 18 years of age or over. Failure to supply such identification will result in no sale or supply of alcohol to that person.

The Proof of Age Standards Scheme (PASS) will be actively promoted at the premises by the display of Challenge 25 posters bearing the PASS logo. A PASS accredited holographic proof of age card will be the main identification document accepted at the premises as proof of age. A



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PASS card must be accepted as proof of age if a purchaser possesses one. Where a purchaser does not possess a PASS accredited proof of age card, only the following alternative forms of identification will be acceptable:-

- (a) Photo Driving Licence
- (b) Passport or
- (c) Her Majesty's Forces Warrant Card
- (d) Challenge 25 to be implemented, all staff to be trained and required to complete refusal logs.
- 17 Children not allowed at bar areas and if under 18 to be accompanied by an adult.
- In order to ensure that noise does not cause a nuisance to neighbouring residents, the designated premises supervisor shall carry out noise assessments at regular intervals whenever regulated entertainment is taking place. A log of the assessments shall be made and will be available for inspection by a police officer or an authorised licensing officer. The log will include the time at which the noise assessment is made; the location at which it is made; any remedial action taken as a result; and any other information as appropriate.
 - In the event of a complaint being made to management of the premises about noise nuisance emanating from the premises, either by a member of the public or passed on by the local authority, a record of the complaint will be made in the log along with a note of action taken to respond to the complaint.
 - After 11pm there shall be no live or recorded entertainment or music played at the premises, either internally or externally. Low level incidental background music is only permissible internally
- There shall be no deliveries or waste collection between 1900 hours and 0800 hours Monday to Friday and no deliveries or waste collection on Saturdays, Sundays or Bank Holidays.
- Prior to the commencement of the development full details of the waste storage facilities for each unit shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the licensing authority. The waste storage area shall provide effective and sufficient storage facilities for refuse and to safeguard amenities and living conditions of any nearby residents particularly with regards to odour, noise and insects. Access to the bin store shall only be used between the hours of 1100 hours to 2200 Monday to Saturday and 1100 to 2100 hours Sunday and Bank Holidays
- No entertainment of an adult nature will take place on the premises.
